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25	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 15, Subchapter 13, is
26	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:
27	<u>6-15-1306. Mobile panic alert system — Required.</u>
28	(a)(1) Beginning with the 2026-2027 school year, each public school
29	district board of directors and open-enrollment public charter school
30	governing authority shall implement a mobile panic alert system that is
31	capable of connecting diverse emergency services technologies to ensure real-
32	time coordination between multiple first responder agencies.
33	(2) The mobile panic alert system required by this section shall
34	integrate with local public safety answering point infrastructure to transmit
35	9-1-1 calls and mobile activations.
36	(b) A public school district board of directors or an open-enrollment

1	public charter school governing authority may implement additional strategies
2	or systems to ensure real-time coordination between multiple first responder
3	agencies in a school security emergency in addition to the mobile panic alert
4	system required by this section.
5	(c) Each public school district board of directors and open-enrollment
6	public charter school governing authority shall establish a schedule to test
7	the functionality and coverage capacity of all emergency communication
8	systems, including the mobile panic alert system required by this section, to
9	determine if adequate signal strength is available in all areas of the public
10	school district's or open-enrollment public school's campus.
11	(d) This section does not apply to a statewide open-enrollment public
12	charter school that operates primarily as a virtual school.
13	(e) The Department of Education may adopt rules to implement this
14	section.
