PROPOSAL FOR AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT (ARPA) FUNDS TEFAP REACH AND RESILIENCY GRANT

The Commodity Distribution Unit (CDU) was notified on May 31, 2022, that it would receive a grant from the Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) Reach and Resiliency grant. The contract starts on June 13, 2022, and it ends on June 30, 2024. The funding will be used to provide equipment to assist agencies in providing USDA foods through the TEFAP program to underserved areas of the State of Arkansas.

The coherent goal for the grant funding is to expand outreach and distribution efforts to improve the accessibility of USDA foods available to TEFAP clients. The CDU will be working with partnering food banks and/or community action agencies to distribute food to underserved participants residing in remote counties or rural areas.

The state of Arkansas will enter a partnership with Eligible Recipient Agencies' (ERA) to improve the distribution and outreach of TEFAP foods. The ERA will be awarded sub grants to assist with the purchase of new transportation or replacement of aging transportation, provide improved longterm storage of TEFAP foods at both ERA facilities and distribution sites through the addition of cold and dry storage equipment, renovate facilities to increase long-term cold storage, and remodel distribution sites to increase the number of clients served.

With the distribution of sub grants to our partnering agencies, we are expected to see an increase of up to 15 percent of USDA foods served to TEFAP clients. We anticipate the funded projects will allow for greater distribution to underserved clients in counties and areas where under 40 percent of persons in poverty are served. The grant will allow partner ERA to better serve participants residing in underserved areas by increasing the amount of TEFAP foods distributed to various distribution sites.

The CDU will monitor all monthly client served reports from partnering agencies, proposed research and outreach documents, progress of activities, invoices for purchased equipment and renovations, representation at community/stakeholder meetings, and consistent communication with partnering agencies through quarterly meetings and emails. The CDU will visit partnering agencies to ensure that equipment, materials and supplies, and renovations that have been purchased or contracted are being used for the specified purpose.

Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Funding Total Amount to be Funded - \$ 17,000,000

The State of Arkansas, Department of Finance and Administration, Office of Intergovernmental Services (DFA-IGS) is requesting the availability of grant funds of \$17,000,000 for the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) program from the ARPA – State-Indirect appropriation within the DFA – Disbursing Officer.

The Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) of 1984 was passed by Congress to assist states in providing high quality services that are directly related to the emotional healing and recovery of crime victims. VOCA funds support a broad array of programs and services that focus on helping victims in the immediate aftermath of a crime and supporting them as they rebuild their lives.

The primary revenue source for VOCA grants is the Crime Victims Fund, which is funded through fines, penalties, and forfeitures collected from persons and companies convicted of offenses against the United States. The U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Victims of Crime (OVC) administers these funds at the federal level while DFA-IGS administers VOCA funds at the state level. Applicants are encouraged to submit projects aligned with the Goals & Objectives adopted by the Advisory Board as the State of Arkansas Victim Services Plan.

Allowable direct services/activities include:

- Immediate emotional, psychological, and physical health and safety of a victim.
- Personal advocacy and emotional support
- Mental health counseling and care
- Peer support
- Facilitation of participation in criminal justice and other public proceeding arising from the crime
- Legal Assistance
- Forensic Medical Evidence Collection Examinations
- Forensic Interviews
- Transportation
- Public Awareness
- Transitional Housing Services; and
- Relocation services

Awards will be made for a twelve (12) month period from October 1, 2023, through September 30, 2024. Awards may be eligible for a one (1) year continuation that is dependent upon available funds and the previous year's performance. Awards will be limited to a maximum of \$300,000. A total of 118 applicants have been received.

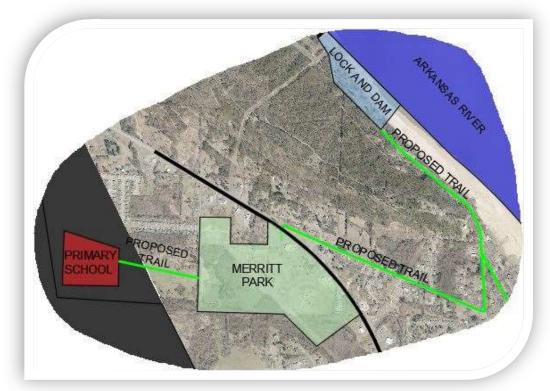


Dardanelle Trail System

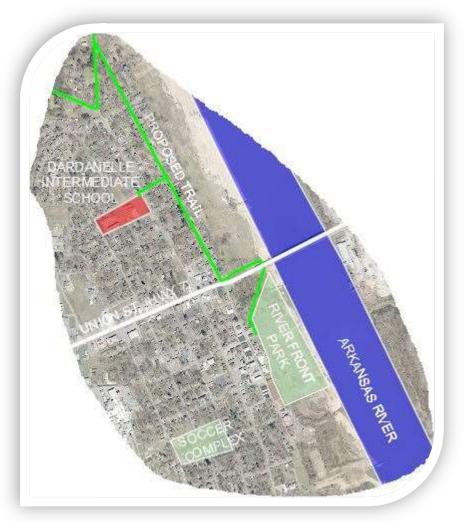








Merritt Park to Lock and Dam - \$805,000

Description: The purpose of this project is to support modernization efforts at the Arkansas Department of Agriculture, Forestry Division's (formerly known as the Arkansas Forestry Commission), Baucum Nursery by purchasing one new tractor, make repairs and upgrades to the storage coolers and modernizing the irrigation systems. Reliable equipment and an automated irrigation system will improve overall nursery operational efficiencies and output.

Scope of Work:

The Arkansas Department of Agriculture, Forestry Commission's Baucum Nursery grows and sells hardwood and pine seedlings for reforestation, specializing in native Arkansas trees, and a variety of genetically improved species. The nursery covers about 220 acres and has been operating since the 1950s.

Nursery operations require labor intensive activities. Unfortunately, workforce turnover continues to cause limitations on seedling production. Improvements of operational efficiency and mechanization will help reduce the limiting factor of personnel shortages and increase nursery capacity.

A major improvement needed is modernizing the outside irrigation system. Currently several labor hours each day are spent manually adjusting the system. With an upgraded computerized system, these labor hours can be used for more productive activities and seedling survival rates will improve with benefit from a consistent computerized irrigation schedule. Plans are to complete the irrigation upgrades for field sections as the crops are rotated. Upgrades will be

made in stages over the next three years. Additional equipment improvements are the repairs/upgrades of storage coolers and the purchase of a new farm tractor which will reduce labor hours used for equipment repairs and maintenance and increase production due to more modern and reliable equipment.

The purchase of a new farm tractor, storage cooler upgrades, and the initial irrigation system modernization will help improve capacity to carry out present and future reforestation needs.

- i. Increased capacity of seedlings produced ("nursery capacity") and/or

AR FY22 State Forest Action Plan Funding-Project Detail

Purpose:

The Urban and Community Assistance Program was authorized by the Cooperative Forestry Assistance Act of 1978 (PL 95-313), Section 9, and amended by PL 113-79, effective February 7, 2014. The Program is intended to provide technical and financial assistance to state forestry agencies for the purpose of encouraging states to provide technical and financial assistance to local governments and others to plan urban forestry programs, and to plant; protect, improve urban forests, and associated natural resources.

The goal of the Urban and Community Forestry Assistance Program in Arkansas is to improve quality of life, environmental health, and community resilience by encouraging and empowering Arkansas communities to develop sound urban forestry management practices.

The Urban and Community Forestry Program of the Arkansas Department of Agriculture -Forestry Division (hereafter, the Forestry Division), which achieves its mission through a variety of programs, is a priority due to the many benefits urban and community forestry can provide for all Arkansans.

Seventy-five percent of Arkansans live in urban areas. Northwest Arkansas was the 13th-fastestgrowing urban area in the United States between 2010 and 2019 (US Census Bureau, 2020). These changes in the landscape are placing demands on our forests and are resulting in reduced canopy, fragmented forests, and loss of buffers in our watersheds. The quality of life in urban centers is directly influenced by the presence of urban trees and natural areas. Researchers have determined that time spent outside and more connected with nature can improve personal sealth. Retention and restoration of the urban forest canopy is difficult and requires

community involvement, therefore community planning efforts need to include elements related to trees. Urban and community trees are relatively more susceptible to mortality pressures, such as disease, invasive species, carbon starvation, storm damage, and mechanical damage. Public outreach and tree care professional development are needed to mitigate tree health concerns. With a 15% poverty rate (US GSA 2018-2019 data), Arkansas has the fourthhighest number of citizens living in poverty in the nation. Economic pressures are impacting the amount of tree planting and tree care occurring in communities; tools, education resources, and expertise are needed to demonstrate the implementation of best community tree management practices in the most resourceful manner.

The Arkansas 2020-2029 Forest Action Plan identified seven primary threats to forestland, and while two of them (urbanization and urban forestry) specifically are addressed through Urban and Community Forestry efforts, the remaining five threats (unmanaged forest property, water supply protection, climate challenges, community wildfire protection, and forest pest issues) are also impacted by work done through Urban and Community Forestry activities. The Arkansas 2020-2029 Forest Action Plan lists objectives specific to the Urban and Community Forestry strategy (Objective 8.1 and Objective 8.2, pages 46-47).

Program goals will be accomplished through the Forestry Division's Urban and Community Forestry program that includes: a program coordinator; a partnership coordinator; District Urban Forestry Representatives/Arborists; a program-funded agreement between the Forestry Division and the Arkansas Urban Forestry Council; and partnerships with city and county governments, local and national non-profit organizations, educational institutions, natural resource programs, the University of Arkansas Division of Agriculture, watershed groups, the International Society of Arboriculture, the Arbor Day Foundation, and other federal, state, and local government

Match is provided by Forestry Division personnel expenses, along with associated indirect

Scope of Work:

The Forestry Division's Urban & Community Forestry Program intends to use a total federal portion of \$62,800 as outlined in the budget worksheet A. \$12,318 will be allocated toward the salary and fringe benefits of the Urban & Community Forestry Coordinator, Urban Forestry Partnership Coordinator, and urban forestry work by the District Urban Representatives/Arborists and other field personnel involved in the specified Urban & Community Forestry projects. \$21,400 is for supplies that will be used to expand potted tree growing operations and improve watering capabilities for tree planting projects, e.g., Shade Trees on Playgrounds. Additional nursery materials, substrate, and irrigation supplies will enable the growth of approximately 400 hardwood seedlings into potted trees. The potted trees will then be available through the Arkansas Community Trees program to municipalities and non-profit organizations for planting in public-use areas. Special consideration will be given for projects that lack the economic capacity to dedicate funds toward increasing community tree cover, thus increasing access to the multiple benefits of trees by populations which have historically been denied access or which have been unable to obtain access to those benefits. \$1,500 will be used for in-state travel to facilitate delivery of the trees and tree-planting assistance to recipients.

Newly planted community trees will encourage a healthy relationship between nature and people, and communities receiving trees will subsequently be encouraged and supported in maintaining abundant, sustainable community forests through the technical assistance offered by Urban & Community Forestry program staff to individuals and communities (Arkansas Forest Action Plan Objective 8.1). Promoting the inclusion of urban forestry in community planning, development, and sustainability will also be accomplished through the Arkansas Community Trees program (Arkansas Forest Action Plan Objective 8.2).

In the Other category, \$12,000 will be used to provide pass-through funding to the Arkansas Forestry Association's Educational Foundation (AFAEF) for the purpose of funding a Teacher Conservation Tour (TCT) focused on Urban & Community Forestry. The TCT workshop series, which has been offered by the AFAEF since 2017, is a professional development opportunity available to both formal and non-formal educators and has been approved by the Arkansas Department of Education for professional development credit for Arkansas educators. Educators will spend two to three days in a municipality or region currently practicing sound urban forestry management practices. They will learn about the benefits of community trees and the importance of advocating for and funding tree planting and tree maintenance activities. Topics covered will be presented in such a way as to allow educators to take hands-on activities and demonstrations back to their students and their communities, thus expanding the outreach of the Urban & Community Forestry program (Arkansas Forest Action Plan Objective 8.2).

Scope of Work:

The Forestry Division gears it activities toward meeting the fundamental requirement of detecting, suppressing, and preventing wildfires. Keeping the numbers of fires and the acres burned below the five-year average is the leading indicator of accomplishing the program's objectives. Our forest fire protection activities must be programmed to cope with these periods of intense fire activity. Each year as the competition for tax dollars increases, the Forestry Division must develop and expand methods of suppressing wildfires with less money.

The Forestry Division fire protection plan is reviewed periodically to determine its effectiveness and plan for the future. Utilizing up to date computer-aided technology, information, the Forestry Division continues to gather and process wildfire, weather, smoke management and prescribed fire information/data. This information is used in analyzing and planning fire control and other activities. Information is also necessary to maintain data for historical purposes and for support in providing statistical information for national programs.

The Forestry Division transmits a daily situation report and annual statistical report to the USDA Forest Service.

The Forestry Division continues to update the fire mobilization plans in each of the seven (7) districts and the state emergency operations plan to emphasize and improve cooperative and coordinated efforts of all agencies having fire or emergency responsibilities. We will update our P25 radios to assure we have communication with all state partners and fire departments.

The Forestry Division maintains a 24-hour coordination center for the safety of the Forestry Division firefighters, pilots, and radio technicians. The coordination center makes it easy for the landowners of Arkansas to notify the Forestry Division of a wildfire. The coordination center dispatches and monitors wildfire suppression and emergency response crews, SEATs, and detection aircraft for all emergency response incidents. The Forestry Division coordination center, utilizing up to date computer-aided technology, disseminates fire and weather information internally, to cooperators, and the public to enhance fire protection throughout the state.

The Forestry Division continues to train its personnel to meet National Wildfire Coordinating Group (NWCG) standards, as well as cooperators and fire departments, in Incident Command System (ICS) for fire and emergency operations. We will use the tablets to further their training by utilizing the Wildland Fire Learning Portal and other training that we can share virtually.

Methodology and Timeline:

Training is an ongoing project within the Forestry Division. The Forestry Division and selected partners provide basic and advanced fire training to employees to strengthen the Division's fire suppression efforts. Each year, May to June, Forestry Division personnel will be sent to participate in the Arkansas Interagency Wildland Fire Academy; a two-week scheduled training session that offers the most needed classes to ensure that personnel are properly trained in fire and other emergency incidents. With the new tablets we can further their training by them taking virtual training and utilizing the Wildland Fire

Learning Portal. The tablets will also give them better use of mapping technology such as Avenza Maps and Arc GIS field maps. The new tablets will be an ongoing project from 2022-2025.

The Forestry Division uses P25 radios to communicate with Emergency Management, other state agencies and local government on ongoing incidents. Our mobile P25 radios are out of date and need to be updated to keep up with the updated technology. We are looking to replace 100 radios throughout the state starting in 2022 and completing it by 2025 pending on the supply chain.

Reference is made to Act 1 of the 90th General Assembly's Third Extraordinary Session, the <u>Arkansas Highway Improvement Plan of 2016</u> (hereinafter called the Plan).

The Plan established the Arkansas Highway Transfer Fund which includes funding that can be utilized by the Arkansas Department of Transportation in State Fiscal Year 2024. By way of this letter, we are requesting the following:

Section 13 of the Plan, Arkansas Code 19-6-832 (c) reads as follows:

In the event revenues to the department are insufficient to fully address the highway construction and maintenance needs of the state, the department may provide a written document to the Governor outlining the reasons that additional funding is needed and requesting that the Governor provide a recommendation to the Legislative Council or the Joint Budget Committee for review and approval of the transfer of funds in the Arkansas Highway Transfer Fund to the State Highway and Transportation Department Fund. The Department is seeking funding from the Arkansas Highway Transfer Fund to provide the required state match and more efficiently utilize our Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2023/2024 Federal funds. Having adequate cash flow from month to month allows us to plan and obligate funds in a more effective manner and prevents the Department from having to delay projects due to a lack of state matching funds.

The passage of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act will continue to provide a substantial increase to Arkansas in the amount of Federal funds for transportation projects in Federal Fiscal Year 2024. The additional Federal funds will also require a proportional increase in the required state match.

Therefore, the Department respectfully requests your recommendation to the appropriate legislative body to transfer these funds from the Arkansas Highway Transfer Fund to the State Highway and Transportation Fund.

On behalf of the Department of Human Services (DHS), I respectfully request a release of Restricted Reserve Fund for the Arkansas State Hospital (ASH) to pay for critical storm damage repairs.

DHS is requesting funds in the amount of \$5,000,000 to pay for necessary storm damage repairs. Some units at ASH are presently uninhabitable due to storm damage. ASH is the only stateoperated acute psychiatric inpatient hospital. These repairs will restore some capacity for provision of psychiatric services to promote recovery in a secured environment. While repairs are covered by insurance, the agency must pay for all repairs upfront, then be reimbursed by our insurance carrier. The projected timeline for completion of all repairs is 18-24 months. To the extent DHS is reimbursed, DHS will, upon receipt of reimbursement, deposit the proceeds into this newly created cash account and said insurance proceeds will be subject to reclaim at the close of each fiscal year for the duration of the ASH storm repair projects, with the intent that the reclaimed funds will be returned to the EBD or Contingency Set-Aside.
