3	REQUESTING THAT THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL PROCLAIM OCTOBER
4	2024 AS RETT SYNDROME AWARENESS MONTH.
5	
6	WHEREAS, Rett syndrome is a rare genetic neurological disorder that
7	occurs almost exclusively in females and rarely in males; and
8	
9	WHEREAS, symptoms of Rett syndrome usually do not appear until six (6)
10	to eighteen (18) months after birth; and
11	
12	WHEREAS, a period of regression follows in which acquired motor skills
13	are lost, leading to lifelong impairments, including loss of speech,
14	seizures, scoliosis, and irregular breathing patterns, with the hallmark sign
15	of Rett syndrome being near-constant repetitive hand movements while awake;
16	and
17	
18	WHEREAS, those diagnosed with Rett syndrome require maximum assistance
19	with daily living activities; and
20	
21	WHEREAS, Rett syndrome is not degenerative, and biomedical research in
22	mice suggests that neurological symptoms may be reversed even after decades
23	of severe symptoms; and
24	
25	WHEREAS, with the discovery of the gene mutation that causes Rett
26	syndrome in 1999, research in the laboratory that proved the theory of
27	reversibility of the a mouse model of the syndrome in 2007, the discovery of
28	breakthrough testing using in vitro models in 2010, and the launch of
29	multiple disease-modifying human clinical trials recently, an unprecedented
30	and historic moment in time has been reached when everything possible must be
31	done to fund the truly life-changing research of Rett syndrome; and
32	
33	WHEREAS, in March 2023, the first treatment for Rett syndrome was
34	approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration and was able to be
35	used by patients; and
