INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2019-126

REQUESTING THAT THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL REFER TO THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON REVENUE AND TAXATION A STUDY OF THE REDUCTION OF SALES AND USE TAXES IN THE STATE.

WHEREAS, Arkansas has one of the highest sales and use tax rates in the nation; and

WHEREAS, the state should reduce the burden on taxpayers when possible in a fiscally responsible manner; and

WHEREAS, the Arkansas Tax Reform and Relief Legislative Task Force studied the state's tax laws and policies to determine how to provide tax relief and reform the state's tax laws; and

WHEREAS, the legislature should continue to study how the state can reduce the sales and use tax rate in a fiscally responsible manner,

NOW THEREFORE,
BE IT PROPOSED BY THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE NINETY-SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

THAT the Arkansas Legislative Council refer to the House Committee on Revenue and Taxation a study of the possibilities for and effects of reducing the sales and use taxes in the state, including without limitation:
(1) The feasibility of reducing the state sales and use tax rate by five-tenths percent (0.5\%);
(2) The overall cost to general revenue and special revenue resulting from a reduction of the sales and use tax rate; and
(3) The possible means of offsetting a reduction in state revenue through savings, income growth, and other means.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the House Committee on Revenue and Taxation invite the Senate Committee on Revenue and Taxation to meet jointly to conduct the study of the reduction of sales and use taxes in the state.
