Re: Arkansas Department of Agriculture, Forestry Division's monthly activity report for October 2019

Dear Senator Bledsoe and Representative Wardlaw:

Per Section 33 of Act 544 of the 2019 General Session, the Arkansas Forestry Commission (AFC) is to report monthly fiscal and agency activities to the Arkansas Legislative Council. Please find attached the report for October 2019.

The 2019 Rural Fire Show was hosted on Saturday, October 5, at the Conway Expo Center. This event is held each year to show appreciation to the many firefighters in the state of Arkansas.

This year, a total of 46 vendors (100 vendor representatives) where present to show off their wares and state of the art equipment to over 650 firefighters and family members that attended the event. These 650 firefighters represented 135 fire departments. Some lucky participants received door prizes that ranged from generators to bicycles.

Altogether, there were 775 participants involved in this year's event. Plans for next year's event have already started to take place.

Arkansas Department of Agriculture Forestry Division October 2019 Activity and Fiscal Report

FIRE PROTECTION

Wildfires: During October a total of 43 wildfires were suppressed for a total of 355 acres burned. Ten-year average for the month of October is 116 wildfires with 1,364.72 acres burned.

Search and Rescue Assistance: Division crews in Pulaski and Faulkner County aided in the search for two missing girls in Pulaski County. The girls where found safe about an hour after arriving.

Storm Damage Assistance: Jonesboro crew assisted in tornado cleanup for the City of Tyronza in Poinsett County.

Rural Fire Protection: Rural Fire Protection (RFP) assists fire departments (FDs) with organization, training and equipment. RFP provides interest-free loans, secures firefighting and emergency service equipment from the federal government, and administers a federal grant to assist approximately 1,000 fire departments. The RFP shop provides maintenance to property destined for FDs and repairs Department equipment as well.

October 2019

- Seven Wildland Fire Suppression training classes were conducted with sixty-two FDs represented (132 firefighters), including five minority departments and three Forestry personnel in attendance.
- RFP received the following through the Fire Fighter Program/Federal Excess Property Program (FFP/FEPP) programs: Eight UTV's (valued at \$90,920.00), a cargo trailer (valued at \$2,525.00) and three pick-ups (valued at \$50,388.06).
- The following was issued this month; a cargo trailer to Forestry-D7 (valued at \$2,525.00), two 15 kw generators one to Fulton FD and one to Fair Hills FD (valued at \$52,668), two UTV's to Forestry D8, and one UTV to Forestry D4 (valued at \$34,095.00) and a 5kw generator to Pangburn FD (valued at \$23,738.00).

- Received 1,022 items in Department of Defense (DOD) Recycling Control Point (RCP) (valued at \$56,279.93) items received for redistribution to FDs this month included rescue wraps, flashlights, national flags and door handles.
- The RFP shop completed maintenance on five Forestry vehicles (Labor savings of \$7,565.00).
- Hosted the 2019 Rural Fire Show on Saturday October 5. Over 650 attendees and 46
 vendors/sponsors participated. A birthday celebration for Smokey Bear's 75th birthday took
 place at the show. Several door prizes were handed out to adults and children. Door prizes
 included: generators, firefighting helmets, jackets, flashlights, Smokey Bear gift baskets, gift
 cards and two bicycles.
- The contract for the 2020 Rural Fire Show has been signed with the Conway Expo Center. It is to be held on Saturday, October 3, 2020.
- Fifty-nine counties have turned in and cleared FFP/FEPP inventory.
- The first draft of the Health and Safety Plan has been submitted for review to Department management. This is due to AWCC by November 10th for the Rule 32 program placement.

Firewise: Firewise staff and district personnel work with fire departments and civic organizations to make communities safer from the threat of wildfire through mitigation projects and community education initiatives. Arkansas leads the nation with 85 active Firewise communities. Recognized communities display Firewise signs at the city limits.

Firewise achieved the following in **October**:

- Conducted initial program presentation at three fire departments.
- Assisted one fire department with required renewal paperwork.
- Hosted informational booth at Rural Fire Show and assisted with the expo.
- Presented national program recognition signage and trophy to one new community.

Law Enforcement: ADA has the authority to enforce the laws of the State of Arkansas, but primarily on unlawful dumping, timber theft, forest fires, and forestry equipment theft and focuses vandalism. ADA aggressively seeks prosecution of violators to deter such crimes. ADA Investigators and district law enforcement officers opened two dumping, one fire related, six timber theft and one forestry equipment theft. They closed two dumping and one timber theft.

FOREST MANAGEMENT

Forest Stewardship/Rural Forestry Assistance Programs: Forestry Division works with a diverse group of partners and professionals to conserve, protect, and enhance the forests of Arkansas. The Forest Stewardship Program (FSP) is an opportunity for non-industrial private forest landowners who are interested in managing their property for wildlife, recreation, soil and water conservation, agro-forestry and/or for timber production to get a comprehensive multiple use forest management plan that is prepared by private consulting or Division foresters, private consulting or AGFC private lands wildlife biologists, and USDA Natural Resource Conservation Service soil and water professionals. Arkansas has 375,088 acres of private land actively enrolled in the Forest Stewardship Program. Landowners that implement practices under their FSP management plans become Certified Forest Stewards. There are 1,264 Forest Stewards owning 283,459 acres in the State.

For October nine FSP plans were prepared on 1,887 acres. In addition, Division personnel provide technical assistance through the rural forestry program to landowners that are enrolled in USDA tree planting and forest management programs such as the Conservation Reserve Program, Environmental Quality Incentives Program, Wetland Reserve Program, and Division Southern Pine Beetle Prevention and Restoration Program. Division foresters prepared 59 forest management practice plans on 4,527 acres. Division personnel conducted 14 prescribed burns on 510 acres.

Urban Forestry Assistance: Urban Forestry Program staff provide assistance and training to communities, educational institutions, non-profit organizations, developers and homeowners on urban tree care, inventory and management.

Urban achieved the following in October:

- Staff conducted a Mini-STOP workshop in Northwest Arkansas, five schools participated and will receive three trees each to plant on their school grounds.
- Staff conducted a tree care workshop for the City of Gentry's maintenance staff.
- Staff attended River Valley Horticultural Products Fall Celebration.
- Staff conducted a tree inventory at UALR Cooperative Extension campus.

Reforestation: The Forestry Division's tree improvement program strives to provide landowners with the highest possible genetic gain in pine and hardwood seed. One method The Forestry Division employs to achieve this objective is by establishing the highest genetic gain material in our newest pine and hardwood seed orchards. The Forestry Division's Baucum

Nursery then makes available to landowners the improved varieties of pine and hardwood, which are the net result of the tree improvement program.

Reforestation Manager, Dave Bowling and Administrative Assistant Krys Newnum attended and worked a booth at the Arkansas Forestry Association's annual meeting in Little Rock on October 8 - 10.

Reforestation Manager, Dave Bowling attended the Southern Forest Nursery Management Cooperative Advisory Meeting at Auburn University on October 30 and 31. The purpose of this meeting is to review accomplishments by the research staff during the previous year and to approve, deny, modify and make recommendations for research projects for the upcoming year.

Baucum Nursery: The Forestry Division's Baucum Nursery produces hardwood and pine seedlings for reforestation and afforestation efforts.

Regular season seedling sales began on July 16. Year to date through October 31, there were 237 online orders and 91 paper orders. Total sales of 1,165,800 pine and 7,222,750 hardwood.

Comparatively, during the same period in FY 19, there were 366 online orders and 91 paper orders. Total sales of 821,325 pine and 5,470,075 hardwood.

During the month of October, Baucum Nursery staff completed the following:

- Continued the following cultural practices for the 2020 crop:
 - o plowed between beds in all planted fields to aerate soil and stabilize beds.
 - Disked layout fields 2 and 7.
 - Completed final preparation for methyl bromide application in field 2 and 7 with use of the do-all implement.
- Spread mulch in layout field 7.
- Collected soil sample in all fields.
- Finished installing culvert for entrance to cooler.
- Completed Methyl Bromide fumigation.
- Completed field inventory on the following species:
 - Loblolly Pine
 - Shortleaf Pine
 - Southern Red Oak
 - Bald Cypress
 - Bitter Pecan
 - o Black Walnut
 - o Button Bush
 - Red Mulberry
- Collected the following pounds of seed:
 - o 197 Chinese Chestnut

- o 4,254 Sawtooth Oak
- Received the following pounds of seed:
 - o 797 Chinquapin Oak
 - o 3,286 White Oak
 - o 1585.5 Persimmon

Tree Improvement: The Forestry Division's tree improvement program provides landowners with the highest possible genetic gain in pine and hardwood seed.

During the month of October, the Bluff City Tree Improvement staff completed the following:

- Marked rootstock in orchards 1718 & 1719 to be removed.
- Applied potassium fertilizer to transplanted grafts in orchard 1721.
- Lined crates with netting for shortleaf harvest.
- Marked trees in orchard 1715 & 1716 for removal.
- Measured 20-year-old shortleaf test in Washington County.
- Started pruning and chipping lower limbs in orchard 1714.
- Delivered Loblolly cones to Idabel OK.
- Harvested cones from controlled crosses of 18 families.
- Harvested 493.5 bushels of loblolly pine cones for Forestry Division seed production.
- Harvested 141 bushels of Advanced Generation Shortleaf Pine for Forestry Division seed production.
- Harvested 525 bushels of loblolly pine cones.
- Harvested 60 bushels of Improved Shortleaf Pine cones.

Best Management Practices (BMP): Forestry Division provides BMP training to loggers and timber companies, conducts courtesy exams prior or during timber harvest operations and addresses logging complaints.

Staff accomplished the following in October:

- Prepared BMP Overview report.
- Checked Hempstead, Clark and Ashley County logging complaints.
- BMP Program review by Southern Group of State Foresters Committee.
- Completed BMP FY 2019 report.

Forest Inventory and Analysis (FIA): Forestry Division in cooperation with the USDA Forest Service Southern Research Station is responsible for collecting scientific data from permanently established plots located all over the state. The plots, each representing 5,937 acres, are strategically located on a three-mile by three-mile grid. The inventory plots have been generating data since they were established in the 1950's. Natural resource managers use the data to make management decisions and follow Arkansas's natural resource trends through time.

FIA completed 72 plots for the month of October. We are now 76% complete with the 2019 Inventory.
