1	(a) When initiating therapy and administering or dispensing, or both,		
2	under a statewide protocol, a pharmacist shall:		
3	(1) Notify the primary care provider of the patient of any drug		
4	or device furnished to the patient or enter the appropriate information in a		
5	patient record system shared with the primary care provider, as permitted by		
6	the primary care provider;		
7	(2) Provide the patient with a written record of the drugs or		
8	devices furnished and advise the patient to consult a physician of the		
9	patient's choice, if the patient does not have a primary care provider; and		
10	(3)(A) Make a standardized fact sheet available to the recipient		
11	of the drug or device.		
12	(B) The standardized fact sheet shall include without		
13	limitation:		
14	(i) The indications and contraindications for the		
15	use of the drug or device;		
16	(ii) The appropriate method for the use of the drug		
17	or device;		
18	(iii) The need for medical follow-up; and		
19	(iv) Other appropriate information.		
20	(b)(1) In addition to the requirements under subsection (a) of this		
21	section, when initiating therapy and administering or dispensing, or both,		
22	oral contraceptives under a statewide protocol, a pharmacist shall:		
23	(A) Complete a training program related to oral		
24	contraceptives that has been approved by the Arkansas State Board of		
25	Pharmacy; and		
26	(B)(i) Screen a patient seeking oral contraceptives to		
27	assess whether the patient has been seen by a primary care provider or		
28	women's healthcare provider within the previous six (6) months.		
29	(ii) If the patient has not been seen by a primary		
30	care provider or women's healthcare provider within the previous six (6)		
31	months, the pharmacist shall:		
32	(a) Provide the patient with a referral to a		
33	local primary care provider or women's healthcare provider; and		
34	(b) Not dispense more than a six-month supply		
35	of oral contraceptives or the equivalent number of refills to the patient		

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     until the patient has been seen by a primary care provider or women's
     healthcare provider.
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                 (2) A pharmacist shall only initiate therapy and administer or
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     dispense, or both, oral contraceptives under a statewide protocol to an
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     individual who is eighteen (18) years of age or older.
