Re: Arkansas Forestry Commission monthly activity report for February 2018

Dear Senator Teague and Representative Jean:

Per Section 42 of Act 841 of the 2017 Regular Session, the Arkansas Forestry Commission (AFC) is to report monthly fiscal and agency activities to the Arkansas Legislative Council or the Joint Budget Committee when the Legislature is in session. Please find attached the report for February 2018.

In the month of February, AFC suppressed 67 wildfires for a total of 1499 acres. Also in the month of February, the entire state received record amounts of rainfall.

Even with substantial rainfall, fire suppression is still a daily mission of the AFC to keep Arkansans safe from the threat of wildfires.

The dry vegetation that is dominate this time of year, burns quickly after rainfall. On Tuesday of this week (March 6) we had 32 wildfires. The winds were high and the relative humidity was low. The AFC is ready to serve even after a large rainfall. The spring "green up" should end this unusual wildfire season.

ARKANSAS FORESTRY COMMISSION February 2018 Activity and Fiscal Report

FIRE PROTECTION

Wildfires: During February a total of 67 wildfires were suppressed for a total of 1499 acres burned. Ten-year average for the month of February is 174 wildfires for 3088 acres burned.

Search and Rescue Assistance: An AFC ranger assisted in a search for 2 missing people at Trigger Gap off Highway 221 S. This search was southwest of Berryville in Carroll County.

Rural Fire Protection: Rural Fire Protection (RFP) assists rural volunteer fire departments (VFDs) with organization, training and equipment. RFP provides interest-free loans and administers federal grants to assist approximately 1,000 volunteer rural fire departments. The RFP shop provides maintenance to AFC equipment.

February 2018

- 117 rural fire departments, (315 firefighters), were provided wildland fire training, including 44-minority departments and nine-AFC personnel.
- RFP received three-brush trucks (valued at \$236,353.33), one Ford F-250 brush truck (valued at \$27,101.33), two M1078's (valued at \$209,252.00), two gooseneck trailers (valued at \$23,145.00), and one conex box (valued at \$4,975.00).
- There were three Department of Defense (DOD) vehicles and other equipment issued to VFDs including three Freightliners (valued at \$403,288.00), one brush truck (valued at \$17,554.00), one generator set (valued at \$13,551.00) and three generators (valued at \$20,838.00).
- 429 DOD Recycling Control Point (RCP) items were received for redistribution to VFDs (valued at \$83,101.75) including fire blankets, hydraulic jack, respirator masks, cold weather jackets, flashlights, and battery chargers.
- The RFP shop completed maintenance on 11 AFC vehicles and four DOD vehicles.
- RFP provided three interest free loans via the Rural Fire Revolving Loan Fund.

2017 Wildfire Volunteer Fire (WFVF) Grant update: The leaf blowers and backpack pumps were
delivered to RFP. Currently bids for the PPE from the State Procurement Office have closed. RFP
requested a sample of the PPE from the winning vendor. Rakes will be ordered once the order for PPE
has been submitted.

Firewise: Firewise staff and district personnel work with fire departments and civic organizations to make communities safer from the threat of wildfire through mitigation projects and community education initiatives. Arkansas is second in the nation with 167 active Firewise communities. Recognized communities display Firewise USA signs at the city limits.

Firewise achieved the following in February:

- Attended Program Managers meeting to deliver national program changes for the 2018 year
- Attended District 7 meeting to discuss district site count and involvement
- Delivered two national program recognition plaques and signage
- Delivered two initial program presentations to interested departments
- Created and mailed letter to all current sites outlining program changes for the year

Law Enforcement: AFC has the authority to enforce the laws of the State of Arkansas, but focuses primarily on unlawful dumping, timber theft, forest fires, and forestry equipment theft and vandalism. AFC aggressively seeks prosecution of violators to deter such crimes. AFC Investigators and district law enforcement officers opened three dumping, four fire related, one equipment theft/vandalism, and four timber theft cases. They closed ten fire related, six timber theft and two dumping cases.

FOREST MANAGEMENT

Forest Stewardship/Rural Forestry Assistance Programs: AFC works with a diverse group of partners and professionals to conserve, protect, and enhance Arkansas's forests. The Forest Stewardship Program (FSP) is an opportunity for non-industrial private forest landowners who are interested in managing their property for wildlife, recreation, soil and water conservation, agro-forestry and/or for timber production to get a comprehensive multiple use forest management plan that is prepared by private consulting or AFC foresters, private consulting or AGFC private lands wildlife biologists, and USDA Natural Resource Conservation Service soil and water professionals. Arkansas has 5,043 landowners owning 930,705 acres that are enrolled in FSP. Landowners that implement practices under their FSP management plans become Forest Stewards. Arkansas has 1,299 Forest Stewards owning 284,381 acres.

For February, 11 FSP plans were prepared on 3119 acres. In addition, AFC personnel provide technical assistance through the rural forestry program to landowners that are enrolled in USDA tree planting and forest management programs such as the Conservation Reserve Program, Environmental Quality Incentives Program, Wetland Reserve Program, and AFC Southern Pine Beetle Prevention and Restoration Program. AFC foresters prepared 88 rural forestry management plans on 8,757 acres. AFC personnel conducted 12 prescribed burns on 1,124 acres.

Urban Forestry Assistance: Urban Forestry Program staff provides assistance and training to communities, educational institutions, non-profit organizations, developers and homeowners on urban tree care, inventory and management.

Urban forestry has been implementing programs and planning more progress for the future. Staff presented at Village Pines Garden Club on how to pick the right tree for the right place. Urban staff continues with monthly articles for City and Town Magazine. Staff also attended a fruit tree training and a volunteer management for community development workshop offered by extension. Staff presented at Pleasant Plains city council meeting for Tree City USA. Final Tree City USA communities were captured for 2017. Updates to Urban Forestry handouts were created. These include Urban & Community Forestry brochure, Tree City USA flyer, and Tree City USA manual.

Forest Health: The Forest Health Specialist, Chandler Barton, assists AFC personnel statewide in efforts to maintain healthy, productive forest ecosystems by preventing, detecting, monitoring, and suppressing damaging insects and diseases. AFC offers technical assistance to landowners who encounter forest health issues.

Arkansas Forest Health Monitoring Program

- Staff attended the national meeting of the Forest Health Monitoring Program (FHMP) in Phoenix, AZ. There he discussed program objectives with leaders from around the country. FHMP is a national program in the State and Private Forestry organization of the USDA Forest Service.
- The Digital Mobile Sketch Mapping system, a tool that uses tablets for aerial survey, is being used in Arkansas and will help AFC monitor forest disturbances.
- Staff and trained AFC staff are able to map forest disturbances, such as bark beetle outbreaks, on an as-needed basis.

Southern Pine Beetle Trapping

- Eighteen SPB traps were placed in southern Arkansas during the last week of February.
- These traps serve as an early warning system to notify AFC of any increases in SPB abundance this spring.

Reforestation: AFC's tree improvement program strives to provide landowners with the highest possible genetic gain in pine and hardwood seed. One method AFC employs to achieve this objective is by establishing the highest genetic gain material in our newest pine and hardwood seed orchards. AFC Baucum Nursery then makes available to landowners the improved varieties of pine and hardwood, which are the net result of the tree improvement program.

Reforestation Manager, Nursery Manager, Tree Improvement Manager and Administrative Assistant attended the AFC mid-year check-in meeting at the Arkansas Agriculture Building on February 8.

Reforestation Manager and Nursery Manager attended a native seed meeting hosted by The Heritage Commission on February 27. Reforestation Manager presented a proposal for a possible partnership by producing milkweed at Baucum Nursery.

Baucum Nursery: AFC's Baucum Nursery produces hardwood and pine seedlings for reforestation and afforestation efforts.

- Made two communication system improvements by adding the following
 - o Answering machine with message for after-hours calls.
 - O Hand held radios for communication between office, field crew, packing crew and cooler. Seedling sales began on July 15. Through February 28, there were 704 on line orders and 164 traditional orders. Total sales of 1,391,850 pine and 5,119,800 hardwood. Comparatively, in the same period in FY 17, there were 465 on line orders and 119 traditional orders. Total sales of 2,296,075 pine and 4,945,775 hardwood.

During the month of February, Baucum Nursery staff completed the following:

Tree Improvement:

During the month of February, the Bluff City Tree Improvement staff completed the following:

- Cut scion material for grafting
- Packed 68 boxes of 3 star containerized seedlings and delivered to Baucum
- Began pruning orchard 1715
- Got bid for orchard spraying
- Inventoried orchard 1721 for grafting
- Grafted 560 pine in greenhouse
- Purchased and transported potting soil for rootstock

Purchased and transported chemicals for spraying production orchards

Best Management Practices: AFC provides BMP training to loggers and timber companies, conducts courtesy exams prior or during timber harvest operations and addresses logging complaints.

The BMP Coordinator conducted one courtesy exam in Cleburne County with four participants. Participants consisted of two landowners, one timber buyer, and AFC's BMP coordinator. The exam addressed the Arkansas Forestry Commissions BMP Program. The BMP Coordinator provided copies of Arkansas' BMP Implementation Reports, AFC's manual "BMPs for Water Quality Protection", the water quality complaint process and MOU with ADEQ. The BMP coordinator provided an overview of the entire program and offered technical assistance, and training to help with their timber harvest.

The BMP coordinator responded to one timber harvesting complaint, through the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ). The complaint was found not valid. The BMP Coordinator responded to the complaint by a site visit and followed up by a report back to the ADEQ.

The BMP coordinator continues to work with the Southern Group of State Foresters Water Resources Committee about the concerns of potential impacts from the 300-page rule of the WOTUS.

The BMP Implementation Survey update, BMP Coordinator continues the ground surveys, collecting data on approximately 250 logging sites randomly selected. Data collection has been slow due to wet weather and flu season. New completion date should be the end of March 2018, with data analysis and final report published by June 2018.

Forest Inventory and Analysis: AFC in cooperation with the USDA Forest Service Southern Research Station is responsible for collecting scientific data from permanently established plots located all over the

state. The plots, each representing 5,937 acres, are strategically located on a three-mile by three-mile grid. The inventory plots have been generating data since they were established in the 1950's. Natural resource managers use the data to make management decisions and follow Arkansas' natural resource trends through time.

FIA completed 57 plots for the month of February. 96% complete with the 2017 Inventory.
