20	(1) Determine if rapid DNA technology is beneficial to the State
21	of Arkansas and require the State Crime Laboratory to promulgate rules,
22	policies, and practices for the use of rapid DNA technology, if it is
23	determined to be appropriate, in the promotion of public safety and criminal
24	justice throughout the state while also protecting personal privacy; and
25	(2) Make recommendations regarding:
26	(A) The development and use of rapid DNA technology at
27	booking stations in the identification of offenders;
28	(B) The development and use of rapid DNA technology for
29	investigative lead testing in local criminal investigation and the potential
30	impact on backlog reduction at existing state and local crime laboratories;
31	(C) The potential of rapid DNA technology to provide quick
32	identification of discovered human remains and to provide answers during
33	times of disaster response; and
34	(D) Opportunities to improve existing privacy assurances
35	for forensic DNA testing or to add new assurances in order to maximize the

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potential for public safety improvements while at the same time protecting
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     personal privacy.
