Re: Arkansas Rehabilitation Services Forgiveness of Student Loan Program – 2018 Update

Dear Senator Sample and Representative Dotson,

This letter is in fulfillment of Section 11 of Act 153 of 2018 requiring Arkansas Rehabilitation Services (ARS) to report to the Arkansas Legislative Council regarding vocation rehabilitation counselors employed by ARS who are eligible for, and have enrolled in the agency's Forgiveness of Student Loan program incentive. The program has been very successful in enhancing the agency's ability to recruit and retain vocational rehabilitation counselors. You may recall that eligible ARS vocational rehabilitation counselors may elect to enroll each calendar year in the student loan forgiveness benefit for a total of five years and \$10,000 in loan payback assistance. As part of the benefit's program obligation, a VR counselor agrees to stay employed at ARS for two years for every year that a student loan payment is made on their behalf.

On July 16, 2018, notification of the program's benefit was sent out to every ARS counselor and district manager throughout the state.

Currently, there are two counselors participating in the program.

Managers and Counselors,

Annually, Arkansas Rehabilitation Services (ARS) is required to inform its employees working as Counselors that have outstanding student loans accrued in the pursuit of a Master's degree in Rehabilitation Counseling of the availability of its Student Loan Forgiveness Program. To be eligible for the program a Counselor must:

- 1. Satisfactorily complete a work probationary period;
- 2. Provide proof of a student loan accrued in the pursuit of a master's degree in Rehabilitation Counseling that remains unpaid, including the name and address of the creditor;
- 3. Sign an employment contract in which the Rehabilitation Counselor agrees to the following:
- a. Work for ARS for a term that equals two (2) years for each year that the program makes a payment on the Rehabilitation Counselor's loan and
- b. Reimburse the program for the full amount of any loan payments made under this program in the event that the Rehabilitation Counselor resigns or is terminated for cause before the term of the contract terminates.

The amount of the payment to be made directly to the Rehabilitation Counselor's loan creditor may not exceed:

- 1. Two thousand dollars (\$2,000) per year; or
- 2. Ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per employee
