Dear Mr. Ferguson,

I am writing in response to your letter of April 24, 2012 requesting:

- 1) A list of all vendors that the Arkansas Insurance Department is working with to implement the Arkansas Qualified Health Plan Program with the federal Health Benefits Exchange;
- 2) The duties the vendors are performing and a listing of the tasks completed; and
- A running total of the vendors' expenditures to date.

Each vendor contract is identified below, followed by scope of contract work, tasks completed, and expenditures to date. All contract funds are federal funds awarded to Arkansas through an Initial Planning Grant (9/30/10 - 9/29/12) and a Level One Cooperative Agreement (2/22/12 - 2/21/13) with option for no cost extension).

Contracted to conduct background research, analyze data, identify options, and recommend a viable plan for developing and sustaining the complete Arkansas Health Benefits Exchange. Scope of work included describing needs, refining goals, and outlining activities, products, costs, timelines, and benchmarks for developing and sustaining a consumer-centered and stakeholder-supported Arkansas Health Benefits Exchange.

Tasks Completed: Policy consultants have assisted and continue to assist with strategic planning and policy research development and implementation of the FFE partnership.

Arkansas Center For Health Improvement (ACHI)

ACHI will oversee the development and implementation of a public educational campaign to describe the benefits of the FFE partnership. ACHI will manage the planning, creation and implementation of the Campaign targeting small businesses in Arkansas to provide accurate information regarding the Exchange and identify benefits the Exchange will provide. ACHI will utilize its existing relationship with Creative Services at UAMS to develop and implement the ACHI branded educational Campaign using a combination of paid and non-paid media, social media, web marketing, and targeted direct mail. ACHI will be responsible for monitoring planning, creative process and media placement, obtaining Arkansas Insurance Department (AID) approval of messaging and plan prior to external launch, and reporting Campaign plans and progress to the Exchange Planning Steering Committee and other key stakeholders as requested by AID.

Total Contract: \$100,000.00 Expended to date: \$3,030.46 Tasks Completed: Creative work produced print and radio advertisement for small business outreach education. Media buys were postponed due to legislative concerns.

University of Arkansas for Medical Services – Partners for Inclusive Communities (Partners) 2001 Pershing Circle, Suite 300, North Little Rock AR 72114

UAMS Partners for Inclusive Communities will be assisting the Arkansas Insurance Department in planning for a successful Health Insurance Exchange by facilitating meaningful stakeholder involvement in the planning process. Partners will provide key informant interviews; plan and facilitate community meetings in 15 communities; provide initial stakeholder report to AID, other research vendors, and workgroups; participate in Stakeholder Summit, including presenting stakeholder report; participate in Public Hearings in each Congressional District.

Total Contract: \$100,000.00 Expended to date: \$52,471.00

Tasks Completed: 66 community meetings were held across 24 Arkansas cities and towns with diverse stakeholders attending. Key informant interviews were performed in preparation for these meetings. Findings from these activities were presented in written and oral formats and assisted with planning the Stakeholder Summit. Arkansas Department of Information Systems (DIS)- Contract 2012065

The goal of this agreement is for DIS to provide the Arkansas Insurance Department (AID) with project management support for IT components of the Arkansas operated functions of the FFE-Partnership Model. DIS will provide one full-time, dedicated Project Manager to support AID in interagency planning. AID will be responsible for the daily functions of this position.

Total Contract: \$ 106,704.00 No funds expended to date.

Tasks Completed: Pre-planning to support development of the required AR/FFE information technology systems.

Development of the Arkansas Qualified Health Plan (QHP) Program at Arkansas Insurance Department in collaboration with the Federally-facilitated Health Benefits Exchange (FFE). The scope of work includes development of business processes for insurance plan certification, recertification, and monitoring to include developing processes and supporting technologies needed to capture information used by stakeholders and provided to users of the FFE.
