1 INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2015-009 2 REQUESTING THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL DIRECT THE SENATE 3 4 COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION TO CONDUCT A STUDY OF POSSIBLE STATE REGULATION OF INTERSCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES IN LIEU OF REGULATION BY 5 6 THE ARKANSAS ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION. 7 8 WHEREAS, the Arkansas Activities Association (hereafter "AAA") is a 9 nonpublic entity that regulates interscholastic activities within the State 10 of Arkansas; and 11 12 WHEREAS, while the AAA receives a great deal of state funding through payments from public schools, it is not subject to state regulation; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, recent decisions by the AAA call into question its ability to 16 regulate interscholastic activities in a fair and well-reasoned manner that 17 includes thoroughly investigating alleged violations of AAA rules, 18 consistently adhering to the provisions of its constitution and bylaws, and 19 respecting the accomplishments and achievements of student-athletes; and 20 21 WHEREAS, given the importance of interscholastic activities to student-22 athletes and Arkansas communities and the amount of state dollars paid to the 23 AAA to regulate athletics, a study should be undertaken to determine if state 24 regulation of interscholastic activities would result in cost savings for 25 public school districts and more efficient and effective regulation of 26 interscholastic activities, 27 28 NOW THEREFORE, 29 BE IT PROPOSED BY THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE NINETIETH GENERAL 30 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 31 32 THAT the Arkansas Legislative Council direct the Senate Committee on Education to conduct a study of the possibility of state regulation of 33 34 interscholastic activities in lieu of regulation by the AAA, including 35 without limitation the possibility of charging the Department of Education 36 with regulating interscholastic activities.
