**RE:** State Park Property Acquisitions

Dear Ms. Garity:

Arkansas State Parks (ASP) has identified priority land acquisitions at the following locations:

- Jacksonport State Park: A landowner adjacent to the park has offered to donate three (3) lots within the original town of Jacksonport totaling 0.50 acres, more or less. The only costs associated with this acquisition would be approximately \$1,500.00 for an appraisal of the property, title commitment policy, and buyer's portion of closing costs.
- Powhatan Historic State Park: In 2008, 2010, and 2013 ASP contacted the Arkansas Methodist Church organization regarding an interest in acquiring the historic 1874 Greek Revival-style Methodist Church, should the organization decide to cease holding services and close the facility. In 2014, members of the church communicated to ASP that the church would no longer be holding services in Powhatan sometime mid-summer 2015. The Methodist Church organization has offered to donate the building and grounds to ASP to preserve and interpret this important piece of Arkansas's history.
- Hampson Archeological State Park: ASP policy is to provide housing for park superintendents and other uniform park management staff, benefiting our department by having staff on-site or nearby to respond 24/7 to emergencies and increase security for protection of park resources and facilities. Although specific housing has not yet been identified for purchase, existing homes meeting ASP minimum standards (3 BD / 1.5 BR, 1,550 s.f. min.) can be purchased in Wilson or the surrounding area for much less than our department could purchase land and construct a residence.

These proposed acquisitions will protect and preserve the parks' natural, cultural, and historic resources and provide additional recreational and educational opportunities for park visitors. The enclosures provide more information regarding each acquisition and include maps and photographs for reference. Grant funds are available to acquire these properties.

In accordance with A.C.A. § 22-4-106, I am respectfully requesting the Arkansas Legislative Council's (ALC) favorable advice to complete these property acquisitions. Governor Hutchinson has given his favorable advice and I ask that you place our request on the September 25<sup>th</sup> ACL agenda. # Jacksonport State Park - Proposed Acquisition

#### Property description:

Two (2) parcels, each containing approximately 0.25 acres, encompassing three (3) lots.

Lots 1, 2, & 3, Block 8, Range 1E, Original Town of Jacksonport, Jackson County, Arkansas.

#### Purpose:

Acquisition of these parcels would enhance the aesthetics of the park by providing Arkansas State Parks control over maintenance and future development activities of the property.

This property is part of long-range planning efforts to acquire inholdings of the original town property to create a cohesive land tract for preservation and interpretation of the historic Town of Jacksonport. The subject tract is adjacent to property that is under negotiations and was previously approved for acquisition.

#### **Estimated Cost:**

Land is to be acquired by donation. Expected costs will be associated with appraisal of property and closing costs only.

# Powhatan Historic State Park - Proposed Acquisition

#### **Property Description:**

The historic (ca. 1874) Powhatan Methodist Church is an approximately 1,520 s.f. structure located on Part of Lots 2 & 6 and all of Lots 3, 4, & 5, all lying in Block 14 of the Original Town of Powhatan, Lawrence County, Arkansas, and containing 0.34 acres, more or less.

#### Purpose:

The proposed acquisition is a donation of the 1874 Greek Revival Methodist Church located in Powhatan, AR. ASP currently owns all the historical structures located in Powhatan (with the exception of the Methodist Church) with each structure representing a different aspect and era of Powhatan. The Episcopal Office of the United Methodists of Arkansas is no longer interested in maintaining and operating the church and has offered to donate the building to ASP. It is a significant piece of Arkansas history and is an important addition to Powhatan Historic State Park's interpretation of Northeast Arkansas and the Black River area.

# **Estimated cost:**

Land and historic structure is to be acquired by donation.

# <u>Hampson Archeological Museum State Park – Proposed</u> Acquisition

#### **Property Description:**

ASP is requesting acquisition of property in the area near Hampson Archeological Museum State Park for use as an employee residence by museum uniform staff. Although no specific property has yet been identified for purchase, it is anticipated that existing residential housing meeting ASP housing standards will come available for purchase in the current or forthcoming fiscal year within the Town of Wilson or surrounding area.

#### Purpose:


ASP is currently developing, through joint partnership with the Town of Wilson and The Lawrence Group, plans for a new museum at Hampson Archeological State Park. The new 8,460 s.f. building will provide exhibit and collection management space as well as office and administrative functions. In addition, a multi-purpose meeting/classroom is planned to accommodate gathering of school and community groups. Outdoor interpretive features such as representations of a ceremonial mound and village structures to help museum guests visualize and understand the activities and life activities of the Late Mississippian period Native Americans who inhabited what is now Mississippi County, Arkansas from 1400 to 1650 A.D. will also be included. This new facility will support the hiring and housing of a full-time park interpreter, for whom employee housing will be provided.


# **Estimated cost:**

Residential property within the Town of Wilson has, on average, been selling for \$60-65 per s.f. for move-in-condition housing near the planned museum site, which is much less than estimated costs for vacant land purchase and new residential construction.








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

Front view (East)






Side view (north)
