Effective Date	Description of Policy Change
8-1-09	Enhanced payment for facility beds certified as Home Style was provided. This was left off of the prior quarter report.
11-1-09	An enhanced care add-on to the per diem reimbursement rate paid to Under 16 Bed ICF/MR providers was provided.
11-1-09	An enhanced care add-on to the per diem reimbursement rate paid 16 Bed and Over Private Facilities ICF/MR providers was provided.
