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2007-2008 Biennium

- In the Fall of 2006, the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department (AHTD) and the Arkansas Education Television Network were nominated for an Emmy Award from the National Academy of Television Arts and Science for the Documentary on Historic Arkansas Bridges.
- In the Fall of 2006, Commissioner John Ed Regenold cut the ribbon to dedicate improvements to Highway 412 near Paragould. The project improved the St. Francis River Relief and the Big Slough Bridge with a four-lane structure. AHTD and the Missouri Department of Transportation coordinated the replacement of the St. Francis River Bridge.
- The Big Dam Bridge, the new pedestrian/bicycle bridge spanning the Arkansas River between Little Rock and North Little Rock, was opened to the public on September 30, 2006.
- On May 16, 2006, the improvements to Highway 63B in Jonesboro were dedicated. Two projects widened Highway 63B from Highway 63 to Highway 49. One project widened Highway 63B (Dan Avenue) from Highway 63 to Culberhouse Road, and one project widened Highway 63B (Johnson Avenue) from Culberhouse Road to Highway 49.
- The first section of State Highway 530 was officially opened June 6, 2006. Also know as the Interstate 69 Connector, the new section connects Highway 278 at its southern end near Wilmar with Highway 35 five miles to the north.
- The 4th Annual Regional Equipment Operators Roadeo was held in Savannah, Georgia, in October 2006. Participants from five states competed in events such as Tractor/Lowboy, Tandem Axle Dump Truck, Single Axle Dump Truck/Trailer, Tractor/Mower, Backhoe, and Motor Patrol. The AHTD team came away from the event as Regional Roadeo Champions for the fourth year in a row.
- In 2007, AHTD received the Excellence in Highway Design Award from the Federal Highway Administration for the Cotter Bridge on Highway 62B over the White River.



- Prissy Hickerson was honored on July 23, 2007 with naming of the Highway 245 Loop in Texarkana as the Hickerson Freeway. The former Arkansas Highway Commission Chairman was instrumental in getting the southern Texarkana loop built, which became part of Future Interstate 49.
- Officials gathered in Hot Springs on July 17, 2007 to dedicate the Highway 70 West widening project. Starting at the intersection of Highway 192, five miles of Highway 70 were widened from a two-lane roadway to a five-lane facility with curb and gutters.
- On August 31, 2007, a signing ceremony was held for an improvement project to widen Highway 94 from Interstate 540 eastward to Highway 71B. This is one of the first projects in the Arkansas Highway Commission Partnering Program. A three-mile section of New Hope Road will soon change hands from AHTD to the City of Rogers.
- On November 19, 2007, officials gathered to break ground for the Highway 70 project in North Little Rock. The project will widen three miles of Highway 70 (East Broadway) between Highway 165 and Interstate 30 from a narrow, four-lane roadway to a five-lane facility with curb and gutters.




