





MEDICAID POLICY CHANGES January - March 2011

Effective Date	Description of Policy Change
3-1-11	The State Plan has been amended to include services for substance abuse to Medicaid eligible children and adolescents and pregnant women through the last day of the month in which the 60 th post-partum day falls, an affordable substance abuse benefit package.
3-1-11	The Dental manual was updated to cover Mobile Dental Facilities so that dentists can treat Medicaid eligible Arkansans who might not otherwise be able to obtain dental care if not for Mobile Dental Facilities.

MEDICAID ELIGIBILITY CHANGES January-March 2011

Effective Date	Description of Eligibility Change
01-05-11	MS 11-01, Access Arkansas: Implementation of SNAP, TEA and TEA Medicaid Online Applications. Applications for the above services can be completed and submitted online.
01-01-11	MS 11-02, Inmates of Public Institutions. An inmate who is in the custody of the AR Department of Corrections or Department of Community Corrections admitted and received treatment in an inpatient facility may be eligible for Medicaid.
01-01-11	MS 11-03, Medicare Savings Program Resource Limit Increase. The resource limit increased to \$6,680 for an individual and \$10,020 for a couple.
02-01-11	MS 11-04, Medicaid Coverage: Children Entering and Leaving DYS Custody or Other Detention Facilities. Living arrangement and its effect on an eligibility determination has been defined. Procedures have been provided for processing Medicaid eligibility for a child released from a court ordered placement.
01-25-11	MS 11-05, 2011 Appendix S. Appendix S has been updated to provide the current year (2011) in the quarters of coverage chart. There was no change in the amount for 2011.
03-01-11	MS 11-06, TEFRA Reevaluation. The TEFRA reevaluation process will begin in the 9 th month instead of the 10 th month.
