Air - 15 Consent Administrative Orders executed addressing violations of permit terms and conditions or recordkeeping requirements. Total assessed penalties = \$39,236.25

Water – 1 Emergency order. May 23, 2011 the Director issued an emergency order authorizing ADEQ to spend Remedial Action Trust Fund monies to secure samples from Choctaw Creek in Van Buren County due to the dumping of 21 drums found in Choctaw Creek, 19 of which were labeled as materials used in the gas drilling industry. ADEQ expended approx. \$2,800 for streams sampling analysis and federal Environmental Protection Agency took responsibility for the sampling and disposal of these drums.

Water - Closed 1 Consent Administrative Order addressing sediment
