WARDEN/CENTER SUPERVISOR'S DECISION

In response to your grievance: Inmate Kelly, you state: "On the 14th of June 2013 I inmate T. Kelly along with inmate K. Hawkins of sanitation was dispatched to report to the sanitation office by Sgt. Crompton and COII Gonder to clenn camera's in the brks. with a 9 to 10 ft ladder, in which I know that Sgt. Crumpton and Gonder knew that this ladder was to short. plus anything over a certain ft by OSHA standards you need a harness & safety hat in which none was provided by either supervisor. so Dir. Ray Hobbs, Warden Watson, Warden Meinzer (security warden) also Warden Jackson treatment warden all along with Sgt. Crumpton & COII Gonder has been negligent & a deliberate indifference in the caused of my fall."

Records show that you did fall from a ladder on June 14/2013 while cleaning the cameras in 13 barracks. COII Gonder had stepped into the 13 and 14 barracks hallway when she heard the inmates shout that you had fallen from the ladder. Medical was immediately contacted; when medical staff arrived, you was placed in a neck brace and on a spine board and onto a stretcher to be escorted to the infirmary. You have been seen by Medical on several occasions since 06/14/2013. According to your Condense Health Services Encounters, you have been assessed: It is noted - No swelling or deformity noted on C-spine, full range of motion to all extremities, all x-ray results are negative, no evidence of fracture, no evidence of dislocation of right and left shoulder, no evidence of acute cardiopulmonary disease; shogun pellets present in the soft tissues of the patients neck - they were present in 2011 (has been several times for this: 06/18, 06/19, 06/24 by APN and 07/03 - inmate has not been taking Rebaxin as ordered per APN on 06/24/13. Instructed to take prescribed medications to help injured muscle.) Normal gait, no spasms noted, has full range of motion with shoulder, no warmth swelling or abnormality noted to area, still complains of back pain. Unable to raise left arm above head, ambulates without assistance, left should Bursitis, refer to Dr. Schock. Requesting renewal of Robaxin and APAP, back pain lower center of back, Per IM history of gunshot wound 20 years ago, no spasms, denies numbness or radicular pain, Left shoulder pain. X-ray reveals shotgun pellets in soft tissues of the left back (these were present in 2011).

Sgt Crompton advises that he was not supervising you; he only called you for work call and was not present when you fell. There is no evidence that you have suffered any long term effects from the fall. However, no evidence has been presented that you received instruction during safety meetings regarding climbing ladders, only Officer Gonder stating to you to not climb all the way to the top but you did not receive a disciplinary for failure to obey the order of staff for disobeying her instructions and staff was not present when you fell. Therefore, I find this issue with merit but resolved due to receiving medical treatment.

MOTION TO DISMISS

COMES NOW the Respondent, Arkansas Department of Correction, and for its Motion to Dismiss, states as follows:

- 1. Claimant is seeking \$204,000.00 for failure to follow policy, mental anguish, pain and suffering and personal injury he received after from a ladder on June 14, 2013. Claimant has failed to state a cause of action under ARCP 12(b)(6) and the claim should be dismissed.
- 2. Claimant alleges the Respondent failed to provide the proper height ladder for the job and failed to provide a safety harness as required by OSHA standards.
- 3. Claimant states that he was using a 9-10' ladder. Claimant is 5'7" tall. The camera height is 13'3" from the ground. Respondent submits that the ladder was more than sufficient in height for the job to be performed considering the claimant would extend his arms to work giving him additional reach. Furthermore, Claimant signed a Weekly Safety Meeting wherein he was advised of ladder safety, including, to 'choose the right ladder for the job.' See Exhibit "A." If Claimant did not believe the ladder to be high enough, Claimant could have requested another ladder.
- 4. As stated in Claimant's complaint and according to witness statements, he was standing on the top of the ladder. The OSHA standards he alleges Respondent violated clearly state that the user should not stand on the top step or top cap. See Exhibit "B". Claimant's own actions caused his injuries.
- 5. The ladder was being held by another inmate while Claimant was cleaning the camera, Inmate Hawkins. Inmate Hawkins released his grip from the ladder while Claimant was climbing down from the ladder and the ladder began to sway and Claimant fell off the ladder.
- 6. Claimant was treated for pain to his right shoulder and lumbar back. He had full range of motion to all extremities and no swelling of the c-spine. He later reported pain upon palpation of the chest wall. He was prescribed Robaxin for the injured muscle, but it was noted when he was seen 3 weeks later, that he was not taking it When he was seen on August 31, 2003, he had a normal gait, no spasms, full range of motion with shoulder, no swelling or warmth, but was still complaining of pain. There were no objective findings of injury. In September Claimant was given a diagnosis of left shoulder bursitis. No spasm, has decreased range of motion due to stiffness and pain, no discoloration, steady gait, no numbness or radicular pain, and requested renewed medications. Nurse restricted his sports and weight lifting for 3 days.
- 7. In order to show that ADC was negligent to recover for his personal injuries, Claimant must show that he sustained damages, that Respondent was negligent and that such negligence was a proximate cause of Claimant's damages. Negligence is the failure to do something which a reasonably careful person would do under similar circumstances.
- 8. Claimant is serving a 60 year sentence for Murder in the First Degree out of Phillips County, Arkansas. He is not eligible for parole until May 31, 2041, 27 years from now. He will be 64 years old then. His projected

- release date is June 1, 2059, 45 years from now. He will be 82 years old then. Any loss of future income is highly speculative at best.
- 9. Claimant has failed to show how the Respondent is negligent and responsible for his injuries. The fact that an injury occurred is not, of itself, evidence of negligence on the part of the Respondent. Claimant must show a breach of duty which he has not done.
- 10. Respondent moves that the commission dismiss this claim. A motion to dismiss is proper when there are no facts upon which relief can be granted. ARCP 12(B)(6). Claimant can show no facts upon which he is entitled to relief and therefore this claim should be dismissed.

USE PROPER LIFTING PROCEDURES:

Take your time to examine the object that you will move. 1.

Arrange the object so that it will not slip, move, or change its balance when you lift it. 2.

Stand close to the load that you have to carry. Center yourself and put your feet apart to the same 3. width as your shoulders.

Keep your back as straight as possible. Bend your knees and squat down to reach for the load. Place 4. your feet close to the object, the closer the better. Make sure that you have a good grasp at the load.

Keep the load close to your body, and get up while you still have a straight back. Keep your back 5. vertical and straight and extend your hands toward the grips you will use to lift the object.

Begin applying force with your legs and arms. Do this slowly. If you give a sudden, hard pull or jerk 6. you could injure your back.

Stand up, if the object is on the floor. Keep the object as close to your body as possible. 7.

Bend through your knees with a straight back to place the load on a different spot. 8.

MOVING CARTS THAT ARE FULL:

Push the load, rather than pull when you must move heavy objects. 1.

If the cart is fully loaded, you will need to have one (1) person in front pulling and one (1) person behind the cart 2. to push at the same time. Never attempt to move a cart that is too heavy for one (1) person to manage.

USING A LADDER SAFELY:

- Choose the right ladder for the job. 1.
- Inspect the ladder before you use it. 2.

Step up on the ladder with care. 3.

Climb carefully. Always use a rail too help assist in keeping your balance. Do not jump from the ladder 4. Climb back down the ladder correctly.

BLOOD SPILL CLEAN-UP PROCEDURES

Restrict access to area, then put on personal protection equipment (two pairs of gloves: avoid tearing gloves, 1. Leak-proof apron to protect your clothes)

Clean-up large amounts of blood with disposable towels in red bag (bio-hazardous bag). 2. Clean area from outward to inward, making contaminated area smaller without stepping into this area.

Do not pick up contaminated sharp objects with your hand; you must use mechanical means, such as a broom 3. and dust pan to push the object into the dust pan.

After clean-up of visible blood, use a solution of 1 part of bleach to 9 parts of water to mop area, after this 4. area is cleaned you must disinfect with germicidal product (Razor Citrus Breeze) allow for product to sit on area approximately 10 minutes or as directed by manufacture before mopping spill.

Apply disinfectant to bottom of shoes with disposable towels to ensure not to spread to other areas. 5.

Before leaving the affected area place PPE (gloves) in a red bag of disposal.

Immediately dispose of red bag once cleanup is complete, place bag in Medical Services in a bio-hazardous 6.

After cleaning, you must remove all personal protection equipment, promptly place all mop heads, aprons, etc. in a red bag then send to laundry for cleaning. All workers must wash their hands immediately after removal of 7. personal protective equipment.

NOTE: UPON COMPLETION OF USAGE OF THE PUSH BROOM, MOP, DUST PAN, MOP BUCKET and SHOWER BRUSH; THESE TOOLS ARE TO BE IMMEDIATELY RETURNED TO THE OFFICER WORKING THE CONTROL BOOTH OR RETURNED TO THE SANITATION DEPARTMENT!!!

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

CLAIMANT OBJECTIONS TO RESPONDENT'S MOTION TO DISMISS

COMES NOW, the claimant, Theodis Kelly, and for his Objection To Respondent Motion To Dismiss, do State the following as cause;

- 1. Claimant disagrees that he has Failed to state a Cause of Action under A.R.C.P. 12(b)(6) and his claim should not be dismissed. Claimant sustained serious injuries that to the date of this filing he is still suffering from pain, undergoing ongoing treatment and therapeutic attempts to overcome the June 14, 2013, fall from a ladder at Varner Unit.
- 2. Claimant submits that the weekly safety meeting document, pages 1 5, showing date of attendance June 14, 2013, with start time of 10:05 a.m. with a end time of 11:08 a.m. is a fabricated document in a effort to practice fraud upon the Arkansas Claims Commission.

In fact Claimant had never seen; what's described as

Respondent Exhibit "A", until he received a copy of the Motion to

Dismiss on June 24, 2014. Claimant was not and has never been

advised of ladder safety or to "choose the right ladder for the

job as alleged in paragraph #3 of Motion to Dismiss. It is the supervisor's responsibility to provide inmates with the proper tools to do state work.

- 3. Claimant never signed the weekly safety meeting form described as Respondent Exhibit "A". In fact the name T. Kelley on page #4, line 68 of Respondent "A" is a forgery. Claimant moves this commission to Order the Respondent's to Produce the complete list 1-68 in support of Claimant's claim for relief. Claimant's name has never been spelled T. Kelley, clearly a forgery, fabricated by Respondent.
- 4. There is no excuse for this attempt to cover up the impossible task of Claimant reaching the camera without climbing to the top of the ladder. Refusal results in a Major Disciplinary for Disobeying a Direct Order, ADC Rule 12-1. Staff supplied the ladder, Staff saw that I had to stand at the very top of the ladder to reach the camera lens, and Staff did not request, order or supply a bigger ladder. Nor was Claimant ever advised or trained as Respondent Exhibit "C" requires. It clearly states, "Train workers to Step Ladder Safety," this never happened.
- 5. Staff should have supervised inmate Hawkins, yet Staff was not in a supervisory position. Staff was unaware that Claimant had fallen until advised by inmates in 13 barracks. The very camera's that Claimant was cleaning is the best evidence to support this claim and should be produce in support of.

- 6. The tragic fall happened over a year ago and Claimant is still in pain, seeking and receiving treatment for his injuries, unable to use the full range of his right arm and shoulder, not to mention the ongoing headaches.
- 7. The Respondent has not set-forth a plausible defense to the gross negligence which took place June 14, 2013. Yet Claimant stands by his written grievance detailing said negligence.
- 8. As for paragraph #7 (seven) of Respondent Motion to Dismiss, Claimant states that;

Respondent is negligent when he or she "fails to use responsible care." A responsible prudent person [supervisor] in a similar situation would have made sure Claimant had the proper ladder, hardhat, safety eye wear and someone to hold the ladder for someone reaching 13 - 15 feet high. A safety harness should have been provided as well for such a task.

- 9. There are four things Claimant needs to show in a Negligence Claim: Duty, Breach, Causation, and Damages.
 - A. Duty is shown in paragraph #8 of this objection.
 - B. Damages have been shown because Claimant was clearly hurt due to a fall from a ladder June 14, 2013, in 13 Barracks, Varner Unit.
 - C. Breach is shown due to the fact that Respondent made no effort to supply the proper tools and equipment for Claimant to perform the job ordered by Respondent.

D. Claimant's injury, pain and suffering are a direct

cause of the negligent actions of Respondent not

providing proper equipment. Respondent's in paragraph

#7 (seven) clearly states, "Negligence is the failure

to do something which a reasonable careful person would

do under similar circumstances.

In Jones v. United States, 91 F.3d 623 (3rd. Cir. 1996), the Court found the prison breached a duty to a prisoner who had a stroke after prison officials withheld his medication. In Plummer v. United States, 580 F.2d 72 (3rd. Cir. 1978), Prisoners successfully made a negligence claim based on exposure to tuberculosis.

CLOSING

Claimant has clearly shown a Claim for Relief. Respondent Exhibit "A", "B", and "C" only strengthens Claimant's claim. Had Exhibit "A" with Claimant's signature and named forged on it, been enforced, as per ADC policy calls for, this tragic fall would not have happened. Exhibit "A" creates a duty, which was breached by Respondent. page 2 of 5 clearly advises on USING A LADDER SAFELY.

Respondent's Exhibit "B", is the type of ladder used for painting, no where near the type of ladder used by the Respondent June 14, 2013, which resulted in Claimant's injuries.

Lastly, Respondent Exhibit "C" which is based upon

Occupation safety and Health Administration from United States

Department of Labor clearly states, "TRAIN WORKERS TO STEP LADDER

SAFETY." Employers, in this case the Arkansas Department of

Correction [Respondent], must train each worker to recognize and

minimize ladder related hazards.

Claimant's serving a 60 year sentence for Murder, not being eligible for parole until May 31, 2041, at which time he would be 64 years old or being 82 years old at his projected release date of June 1, 2059, still does not negate the fact that Respondent's Negligence cause Claimant serious injury and are liable for damages and medical treatment.

Based on these facts, Claimant has stated a claim upon which relief can be granted under A.R.C.P. Rule 12(b)(6).

WHEREFORE, for the reasons stated, Claimant ask the Claims
Commission to Deny Respondent's Motion to Dismiss, and grant any
and all relief deemed just and proper.
