# FY 2021 – EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PERFORMANCE GRANTS (EMPG) PROGRAM AMERICAN PLAN RESCUE ACT

This American Plan Rescue Act (ARPA) funding was awarded for FFY21 as Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) funding to supplement the current EMPG program in the state. This additional award of \$1,295,961 will be used on IT equipment and services needs for the agency in planning, responding to and recovering from all hazards occurring in the state. The following details how this additional funding will be spent.

## EQUIPMENT

It will be used to replace computers that have reached end of life or have become damaged and to replace radios, servers, install LED panels in the State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC), upgrade security, and update the agency Mobile Command Vehicle. ADEM is in the process of replacing AWIN radios that are at the end of life. We are replacing servers that form a cluster to host our virtual environment where all application servers are hosted.

LED panels will replace ageing rear facing projectors in the SEOC. The 4k UHD LED panels will increase resolution and maintain compatibility with new and existing technologies. Existing SEOC security system will be replaced with new proximity readers and biometric security features to increase both cyber and physical security in the SEOC. There will be software and card readers and monitoring points replaced. This will incorporate PIV-I compliance to meet proposed FEMA standards.

Several updates are needed to the mobile command vehicle. ADEM will update and outfit with new P25 compliant Arkansas Wireless Information Network (AWIN) radios. The current AWIN (mobile and portable) radios located in the vehicle are end of life and not upgradable. Older UHF/VFH equipment with will be replaced with new digital equipment and antennas. The on-board security system will be replaced to incorporate high definition cameras for perimeter monitoring. Switches will be upgraded to a more secure platform to meet state cyber security standards.

## Software Licenses and Maintenance-

Various software maintenance and software licenses will be renewed with this award including:

Fortinet: is the main firewall licensing and includes the software maintenance contract.

ARGIS/ROK: is Geospatial Information Systems program.

WebEOC: Annual maintenance and support contract for the software used in the SEOC.

Training Database Software: Annual maintenance and support for software that tracks/schedules all responder/students for training sponsored by ADEM.

COMPSYS: Provides an annual maintenance contract to host our exchange 2016 and skype for business. This includes spam filtering with proactive threat monitoring and email encryption.

#### Vaccine REACH

UAMS will use the funding to strengthen vaccine confidence, provide further information and education on vaccines, improve rates of vaccinations in the region and across the country, and meet the needs of the target population, UAMS and Vaccine REACH partners will implement the following objectives:

**Objective 1:** Leverage long-standing community-based networks with a) community pharmacies; b) AHEC/Regional Programs; c) community hospitals d) community-based organizations; e) faith-based organizations; and f) Minority Serving Institutions and HBCUs to implement *Vaccine REACH*.

**Objective 2:** Mobilize network partners to quickly hire, train, and deploy CHWs who will educate, build vaccine confidence, and assist individuals in receiving the COVID-19 vaccination.

**Objective 3:** Implement coordinated communication and health education plan that focuses on building vaccine confidence through culturally and linguistically appropriate communication using plain language and is deployed using both traditional and non-traditional media sources.

**Objective 4:** Implement mobile vaccination events to reach the populations most in need (rural and remote locations and urban neighborhoods with low access and low vaccination rates) and ensure all community members are able to receive the COVID-19 vaccine.

Dear Secretary Walther:

Phillips Community College of the University of Arkansas respectfully requests review of this revised appropriation from the American Rescue Plan Act to (1) provide direct grants to students for emergency relief under the provisions provided by the US Department of Education, (2) reimburse PCCUA for payroll related COVID-19 related expenses, and (3) for other COVID-19 related expenses for PPE, student aid, and technology-related expenses as allowed for by federal regulations.

## A brief synopsis of the changes reflected in the request are as follows:

- Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students
  - Revise wording from "maximum" to "minimum" when referring to grant award amounts
- Institutional Funds
  - Reduction of amount requested for Salaries and Fringe Benefits
  - Reduction of amount requested for Operating Expenses
  - Increase in amount requested for Capital Outlay to help defray the cost of HVAC upgrades to improve airflow and air quality/purification
  - Addition of line item for Indirect Cost Recovery to help defray the extensive administrative costs of the program (purchasing, reporting, etc..)
- Additional \$204,756 in funding provided under the Strengthening Predominantly Black Institutions (PBI) program

The total funding to be disbursed or reimbursed from the Education Stabilization Fund (American Rescue Plan) for Phillips Community College of the University of Arkansas is \$3,575,324 and additional supplemental funding of \$204,756.

#### Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students

PCCUA intends to distribute emergency grants to students during the fall, spring, and summer semesters of the 21-22 academic year from American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. Any remaining grant funds will be distributed during the 22-23 academic year if available. During each semester, students with PELL grant eligibility will be granted priority and will receive a higher grant amount than those that are non-pell

eligible. **Minimum** grant awards provided during the fall and spring semesters at this time are as follows:

- \$1,000 for Pell eligible full-time students
- \$750 for Pell eligible part-time students
- \$750 for non-pell eligible full-time students
- \$500 for non-pell eligible part-time students

Maximum grant awards provided during the summer semester are as follows:

- \$500 for Pell eligible full-time students
- \$350 for Pell eligible part-time students
- \$350 for non-pell eligible full-time students
- \$200 for non-pell eligible part-time students

Students will be required to complete an online certification of COVID need to receive an award.

Total funding for emergency grants to students totals \$1,802,459

#### Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund Formula Grants – Institutional Funds

For the institutional portion, PCCUA intends to use the funds for purposes outlined in the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. The following table outlines the intended purposes for the use of grant funds consistent with the requirements of the grant. The guidance accompanying the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 states that institutions must use a portion of their funds to implement evidence-based practices to monitor and suppress coronavirus in accordance with public health guidelines and conduct direct outreach to financial aid applicants about the opportunity to receive a financial aid adjustment due to the recent unemployment of a family member or independent student, or other circumstances. Through the following plan, PCCUA intends to accomplish both of these directives.

#### **Salaries and Fringe Benefits**

- Salary and fringe benefits for distance learning staff (50%) to assist with expanding online learning capabilities.
- Salary and fringe benefits for computer technician (50%) and extrahelp in the IT department to assist with expanding online offerings, server capacity, student computer loan program for distance learning and other duties.
- Salaries and fringe benefits for the above positions for two years pending approval of one-year no-cost extension.

#### **Operating Expenses**

 Conduct mailings and/or other communications with students concerning the opportunity to receive a financial aid adjustment due to the recent unemployment of the student or a family member. \$162,500

- Continue CDC protocols for disinfecting and sanitizing as necessary by purchasing hand sanitizer, antibacterial hand soap, wipes, and other necessary materials and supplies.
- Continue student services to assist with online learning such as zoom license, online assistant/chat box, and other services.
- Install touchless water fountains to help curb the spread of viruses
- Install touchless toilet flushers to help curb the spread of viruses
- Install touchless soap/paper towel dispensers to help curb the spread of viruses
- Install touchless hand faucets to help curb the spread of viruses
- Purchase and install other features to enhance a clean and sanitary environment for faculty, staff, and students.
- Surge protection/power restoration for main servers/administration building
- Expanding classroom and laboratory zoom and online learning capabilities (smartboards, webcams, computers, etc.)
- Expand server capabilities and security to handle online learning
- Install additional wireless access points and expanding wireless access to students
- Purchase additional software license to accommodate expanding online learning capabilities
- Purchase additional faculty and staff material and supplies to accommodate online learning and meeting. Examples include desktop computers, laptop computers, webcams, etc.
- Provide services to students to promote mental and physical awareness and health.
- Provide services, supplies, and other costs to promote student success through increasing enrollment, retention, graduation, and transfer rates.

During the 91st General Assembly Regular Session of 2017, the Legislature passed Act 912 to create the office of the Chief Data Officer (ARData) within the Division of Information Systems. Many of the duties of the CDO Office and Data and Transparency Panel were accomplished in FY2021 including significant progress towards statewide master data management, data sharing, data governance, and the statewide longitudinal data system. The CDO office has worked with departments on establishing Federal and philanthropic grant funding to sustain these efforts through FY2024.

One of the key remaining duties of the CDO Office and the Data and Transparency Panel is support for "open data exchanges that facilitate standardized access to data within, between, or outside systems or state departments". The Division of Information Systems is a cost recovery agency limited to a chargeback methodology of allowable costs as defined in 2 CFR § 200.405. The open data services supported by the CDO Office have statewide benefits that cannot be objectively charged or assigned to a cost objective in accordance with the relative benefits received. Because of this we are requesting funds from the Innovation and Project Development Fund be approved to fund the staffing and direct costs for supporting statewide transparency and data sharing efforts. Infrastructure and operations for these efforts are supported by CAO/DCDO Robert McGough, and security management and oversight is provided by CISO Gary Vance.

This approval request is for an amount of \$229,034 from the Innovation and Project Development Fund to cover the expenses associated with these positions and direct costs. Attached you will find the calculations for this cost estimate.
