I respectfully request the introduction of the attached appropriation bills for the Arkansas Department of Human Services for the 2018-2019 Fiscal Year. These bills reallocate the resources of the Department in order to implement Act 913 of 2017.

Act 913 of 2017 was enacted to promote and improve efficiency and quality in the Department of Human Services. It created the Division of Provider Services and Quality Assurance, and merged the Division of Aging and Adult Services with the Division of Behavioral Health Services. These bills reallocate resources from current Department allocations to the various divisions in order to meet the needs of the reorganization detailed in the Act.

These changes do not increase the amount of appropriation, funding, or positions of the Department.

I appreciate your consideration of this matter.

Funds 5 allocated under the appropriation for community-based services, for Grants to 6 Community Providers, in the Developmental Disabilities Services - Grants-in-7 Aid appropriation in this act shall be used only to provide services through 8 private community based services licensed or certified by the Arkansas 9 Division of Developmental Disabilities Services (DDS). Non-profit community-10 based programs licensed by the Division of Developmental Disabilities 11 Services are quasi-governmental instrumentalities of the state which provide 12 supports and services to individuals who have a developmental disability or 13 delay, who would otherwise require supports and services through state-14 operated programs and facilities owned by the State of Arkansas. It is the intent of this section that DDS, as a general policy, 23 maximize the use of Medicaid funding available for appropriate services. 24 The State shall require each provider funded from this Appropriation for 25 community based services, including funding from the Grants/Patient Services 26 Line, in the Developmental Disabilities Services - Operations appropriation, 27 or from the Grants to Community Providers Line, in the Developmental 28 Disabilities Services - Grants-in-Aid appropriation, to screen each 29 individual to whom services are provided for a determination of eligibility 30 or ineligibility for Medicaid coverage within thirty days of the first date 31 that services are provided. - 26 2. Supply statistical and financial data to the Department of Human
- 27 Services Division of Developmental Disabilities Services.
- 28 3. Establish and maintain a sound financial management system in accordance
- 29 with guidelines as set forth by the Department of Human Services.
- 4. Establish and maintain community support programs designed to provide
- 31 coordinated care and treatment to ensure ongoing involvement and
- 32 individualized services for persons with disabilities. Every community
- 33 support program shall provide services for persons with disabilities who
- 34 reside within the respective area of the program.
- 35 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2017
- 36 <u>2018</u> through June 30, 2018 <u>2019</u>.

1 2 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 3 4 DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES - TIMBER SALES PROCEEDS - CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS AND 5 EQUIPMENT. The Division of Developmental Disabilities Services is authorized 6 to use the administrative operating accounts for capital improvements to 7 physical plants and for the purchase of capital equipment. The funds shall be 8 held by the Department of Human Services - Division of Developmental 9 Disabilities Services from the proceeds of the sale of timber that may be 10 harvested from land owned by the Division of Developmental Disabilities 11 Services. All funds deposited and all expenses shall be tracked separately. 12 The harvesting of timber is specifically authorized to provide funds to 13 finance capital improvements to the physical plants and for the purchase of 14 major capital equipment. 15 The Division of Developmental Disabilities Services shall report all 16 income derived from timber management to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the 17 State and the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee. Any contracts initiated for the harvesting of timber shall be submitted to the 18 19 Review Subcommittee of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget 20 Committee for prior review. All expenditures of funds derived from the sale 21 of timber will be expended in accordance with relevant state purchasing laws. 22 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2017 23 2018 through June 30, 2018 2019. 25 26 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

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SECTION 15. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS DEVELOPMENT CENTERS AND COMMUNITY PROVIDERS.

- (A) The Developmental Disabilities Services Board or the Department of Human Services shall not close any of the state administered Human Development Centers which are located at Conway, Arkadelphia, Jonesboro, Booneville, and Warren.
- 32 (B) The Department of Human Services shall continue to accept clients for 33 whom it has determined that therapy and residential services are needed at 34 state administered Human Development Centers and Community Programs licensed 35 by DDS shall continue to accept clients for whom it has been determined in 36 accordance with federal law that are in need of services in the community.

- 1 (C) Except for use as federal matching funds, no funds for community based
- 2 services licensed by DDS shall be transferred from Grants to Community
- 3 Providers line item of the Developmental Disabilities Services Grants-in-
- 4 Aid appropriation unless the transfer(s) directly benefit(s) community based
- 5 services for persons with developmental disabilities or from the
- 6 appropriation for the Human Development Centers unless the transfer(s)
- 7 directly benefit(s) the Human Development Centers.
- 8 (D) Nor shall any general revenue funding as of July 1, 2017 2018 from the
- 9 Grants to Community Providers line item of the Developmental Disabilities
- 10 Services Grants-in-Aid appropriation for persons with developmental
- 11 disabilities or from any other general revenues as of July 1, 2017 2018,
- 12 applied as federal matching funds for community based services licensed by
- 13 DDS on July 1, 2017 2018 be reduced below the approved funding level on July
- 14 1, 2017 2018; nor shall the general revenues applied as federal matching
- 15 funds for the Human Development Centers be reduced below the approved funding
- 16 level on July 1, 2017 2018.
- 17 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2017
- 18 2018 through June 30, 2018 2019.

- 20 SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. AUTISM
- 22 TREATMENT AND COORDINATION. The Department of Human Services Division of
- 23 Developmental Disabilities Services shall promulgate rules and regulations
- 24 regarding the licensure and oversight of Applied Behavior Analysts as
- 25 described in Arkansas Code § 23-99-418. The rules and regulations shall
- 26 include a requirement for a licensure application fee equal to that charged
- 27 to applicants to be licensed as a psychologist as described in Arkansas Code
- 28 § 17-97-309. Proceeds from this fee are declared as cash funds.
- 29 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2017
- 30 <u>2018</u> through June 30, 2018 <u>2019</u>.

- 32 SECTION 17. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
- 33 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
- 34 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
- 35 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
- 36 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary

1 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 2 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 3 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 4 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds. 5 6 SECTION 18. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 7 8 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 9 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 10 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 11 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 12 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 13 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 14 15 SECTION 19. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 16 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits 17 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2018 is essential to the operation of 18 19 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 20 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2018 could work irreparable harm 21 22 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental 23 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act 24 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health 25 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2018. 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35 36

- 32 (a) There is established on the books of the Treasurer of State, Auditor 33 of State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a fund to be known as the 34 Department of Human Services Renovation Fund.

1 provide them can vary significantly based on many factors, including natural 2 disasters, changing federal mandates and funding sources, demographic shifts, fluctuating court-ordered services, social trends, and job market variations 3 4 such as nursing shortages. The impact of these factors through the course of 5 any fiscal year make it very difficult for the Department to accurately 6 predict the exact needs for funding, appropriation and positions in each of 7 its over 100 different appropriations. To ensure that it can respond quickly 8 to changing client needs and make the most effective use of the resources 9 allocated to it, the Department of Human Services shall be authorized to 10 utilize the reallocation of resource authority to make the proper adjustments 11 to the budgets within the Department. Therefore, upon determination by the 12 Director of the Department of Human Services that a reallocation of resources 13 within the department is necessary for the efficient and effective operation 14 of the department, the director, with approval of the Governor, shall have 15 the authority to request, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, a 16 transfer of positions, appropriations, line item appropriations, and funds 17 within or between existing and newly created divisions, offices, sections, or 18 units of the department. Provided, however, that no transfer of funds or 19 appropriation that provides direct support or matching support for the 20 Arkansas Medicaid Program shall be made to any other fund account or 21 appropriation that does not directly support the Arkansas Medicaid Program. 22 Further, no positions, funds, or appropriation authorized during the budget 23 process for the Division of Children and Family Services' compliance with 24 initiatives established under the Angela R. consent decree shall be 25 transferred to any other division. - 2 can render needed services of equal quality at rates less than traditionally
- 3 charged and who meet the applicable federal and state laws, rules and
- 4 regulations pertaining to the provision of a particular service;
- 5 (2) Identification that a provider or group of providers has consistently
- 6 charged rates to the Arkansas Medicaid Program greater than to other
- 7 purchasers of medical services of similar size;
- 8 (3) The Division determines that there has been significant changes in the
- 9 technology or process by which services are provided by a provider or group
- 10 of providers which has affected the costs of providing services, or;
- 11 (4) A severe economic downturn in the Arkansas economy which has affected the
- 12 overall state budget of the Division of Medical Services.
- 13 The Division of Medical Services shall make available to requesting
- 14 providers, the CMS's inflationary forecasts (CMS Market Basket Index). Rates
- 15 established with cost of living increases based on the CMS Market Basket
- 16 Index or other indices will be adjusted annually except when the state budget
- 17 does not provide sufficient appropriation and funding to affect the change or
- 18 portion thereof.
- 19 (b) Any rate methodology changes proposed by the Division of Medical
- 20 Services both of a general and specific nature, shall be subject to prior
- 21 approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee.
