Dear Senator Dismang and Representative Jean:

Last fiscal year, I requested an increase for the District Judge Travel Expense appropriation line item. The total appropriated for that line item was \$75,000. Attached to this letter is a detailed report showing the expenditures of individual judges and when they made their reimbursement request.

My staff has reported that some judges hold receipts and submit several months' worth of travel reimbursements at one time. I believe that a better process would be to require all receipts and travel expenditures to be submitted within 60 days of when the expense occurred. This would help my office keep you better informed of the monetary status of the budget instead of me having to come before you to request an appropriation increase.

As of January 31, 2024, \$38,525.09 from the appropriated \$65,000.00 has been spent in this line item, or 59.3% of the budget. That percentage is near where I would expect it to be at this time of year. However, that is dependent upon whether all parties have submitted their travel expense reimbursements for seven out of twelve months of the fiscal year, which is why I am respectfully making these requests:

- 1. Please increase the District Judge Travel Expense appropriation line amount from \$65,000 to \$80,000 for FY2025 and subsequent years.
- 2. Add special language associated with this appropriation to make clear that my office can require travel receipts be submitted within 60 days of when the expense occurred. That language is below:

Section 10. Special Language. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. JUDICIAL DISBURSEMENTS. The Auditor of State shall be disbursing officer for the funds appropriated for Travel Expense Reimbursements for Judges herein. Disbursement of funds shall be subject to review by the Auditor of State for accuracy and consistency with applicable travel guidelines. Any request for

reimbursement under the DISTRICT JUDGES TRAVEL EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT line item must be submitted to the Auditor of State within sixty (60) days of end date for the underlying travel or expense.

which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. SECTION 12. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2024 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2024 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2024.
