Code Section	Title	Summary
§ 1-4-138	State firearm	Provides that the shotgun is the official state firearm.
§ 5-71-228	Obstruction of shooting, hunting, fishing, or trapping activities	Provides that it is unlawful for any person to willfully obstruct or impede the participation of any individual in the lawful activity of shooting, hunting, fishing, or trapping. A person who violates the provision while in possession of a firearm is guilty of a Class A misdemeanor, otherwise, a Class B misdemeanor.
§ 15-42-104	Hunting and fishing licenses for residents — Special fees	Establishes fees and limits on fees for hunting and fishing licenses. Distinguishes between a license for the privilege of taking small game and one (1) deer by the use of a modern center-fire firearm and a license for the privilege of taking three (3) deer and all other game by any method.
§ 15-43-105	Prima facie evidence of hunting and fishing	Provides that the possession of firearms in fields, forests, along streams, or in any location known to be game cover is prima facie evidence of hunting.
§ 15-43-205	Negligent discharge of firearms while hunting deer	Creates the offense of negligent discharge of firearms while hunting deer, which applies when a firearm is negligently discharged under circumstances that endanger the person or property of another and is punishable by a fine of \$100 to \$1,000 and imprisonment of thirty (30) days to six (6) months.
§ 15-43-238	Hunter training and safety program	Authorizes the Game and Fish Commission to establish a hunter training and safety program and provides that the program may include instruction designed to teach the safe and proper handling of firearms, the suitability and effectiveness of different types of firearms for hunting various types of game, the effective range and killing power of various firearms, and the best placement of shots on large game.
Amendment 88, Arkansas Constitution	Wildlife conservation and management	Amendment 88, § 1 preserves the right of citizens of the state to hunt, fish, trap, and harvest wildlife. Subdivision (c)(2) provides that the amendment is not intended to affect other law related to trespass, private property rights, eminent domain, public ownership of property, or any law concerning firearms unrelated to hunting.
