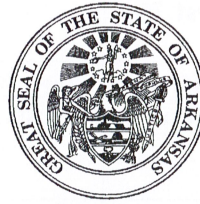
All local CASA programs in Arkansas recruit, train, and supervise community volunteers to advocate for the best interest of abused and neglected children in Circuit Court, Juvenile Division pursuant to A.C.A. §9-27-316(g). The National CASA/GAL Association and Arkansas CASA require all programs to pass a rigorous quality assurance process based upon state and national standards. All programs are required to stay in compliance with state guidelines and national standards for CASA advocacy and program management. Should a program not be in good standing, AOC will hold said funds to allow the program to correct their inadequacies. However, should the issues not be rectified towards the end of the fiscal year, the funds should be reallocated to programs in good standing to help support this important work.

State CASA grants allow local programs to pay for: salaries and related costs for program staff to recruit, supervise, and manage volunteers; necessary travel for continuing contact with children and training; providing supplies and equipment; assisting with rent, utilities, printing, audits, insurance, and membership in the National CASA/GAL Association.

Dear Senator Flippo and Representative Eaves:

The Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) respectfully requests to modify the FY2024 State CASA Grants allocation.

Due to one program being out of compliance with required state guidelines and national standards for program management, the 4th quarter disbursement was not distributed to them. The AOC proposes that the remaining funds should be reallocated equally among the remaining 22 CASA programs.

The National CASA/GAL Association and Arkansas CASA require all programs to pass a rigorous quality assurance process based upon state and national standards. All programs are required to stay in compliance with state guidelines and national standards for CASA advocacy and program management. Should a program fall out of good standing, AOC will hold funding to allow time for the program to correct their eligibility.

However, in the present case, the program in question has failed to maintain their 501(c)(3) nonprofit status as is required by National CASA/GAL Association standards for local programs and Arkansas standards and guidelines for CASA programs. The AOC has been in communication with the program and the issues are highly unlikely to be rectified prior to the end of fiscal year 2024. Accordingly, the AOC now seeks to reallocate the undistributed funds to programs in good standing to help support this important work. The proposed reallocation is as follows:
