The WCAAA will work with coalition members and collaborating entities, law enforcement agencies, area schools and colleges, health clinics, home health agencies, local municipalities, other tobacco coalitions, minority and faith based organizations, youth oriented organizations, local and state wide chambers of commerce, and local employers in targeted counties to promote activities. The WCAAA Tobacco Prevention Coalition will also work collaboratively with statewide and national health care advocates such as American Cancer Society, American Heart and Lung Associations, Coalition for a Tobacco Free Arkansas, youth coalitions and others. A series of activities and programs will be conducted via business and community forums, presentations, media efforts (radio, print, video, and social media). Other activities will include surveillance with tobacco retailers; educating the targeted community on laws pertaining to ecigarettes, sales of tobacco products to minors, excessive signage, and ACT 811 of 2011.
