We have newly developed collaborations with key partners in mental health treatment centers around the state, in addition to those within the state government. The objective of this project is to train key personnel within the mental health treatment centers to integrate and provide tobacco cessation treatment within the already provided services within the next one year. During these training processes, work will also be done to address education, policy and systems change, specifically with the goal of significantly increasing the number of tobacco users with mental illness who quit each year to reduce mortality and morbidity from tobacco use, and their associated costs. Training will include those that provide certified tobacco treatment specialists and consumers trained in peer-to-peer counseling.
