Purpose of Grant / Reason for addition or change (include attachments as necessary to provide thorough information):

The Arkansas Department of Health (ADH) was provided additional federal funding by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) through the Epidemiology and Laboratory Cooperative Agreement entitled "SHARP 2". This CDC funding will assist ADH with projects associated with the strengthening and securing of resources for the current Healthcare-Associated & Antimicrobial Resistant Infections (HAI/AR) Program across 5 project areas: the HAI/AR Program Network for Prevention and Outbreak Response, Antimicrobial Resistance Laboratory Network, Antibiotic Stewardship, Enhancing the Use of the National Healthcare Safety Network, and Project Firstline to provide frontline healthcare worker education. The CDC grant titled AMD Sequencing & Analytics 2 (Supplemental) will provide funding for addressing lab needs for next generation sequencing, bioinformatics and advanced molecular testing of emerging diseases. The ADH Public Health Lab requests appropriation for the granted funds. Also, the Arkansas Department of Health (ADH) was provided federal funding by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) through a grant titled "Data Modernization 2". The CDC grant will assist ADH with projects associated with the Data Modernization Initiative proposed by the CDC through its piorneering grant "Data Modernization 1" awarded to ADH in August 2020. This funding will specifically address project associated with maintenance of health information systems and enhancements to the State's electronic disease surveillance system and the Public Health Lab's Laboratory Informaion Management System.

PROPOSAL FOR AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT (ARPA) FUNDS TEFAP REACH AND RESILIENCY GRANT

The Commodity Distribution Unit (CDU) was notified on May 31, 2022, that it would receive \$592,370.00 from the Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) Reach and Resiliency grant. The contract starts on June 13, 2022, and it ends on June 30, 2025. The funding will be used to provide equipment to assist agencies in providing USDA foods through the TEFAP program to underserved areas of the State of Arkansas.

The coherent goal for the grant funding is to expand outreach and distribution efforts to improve the accessibility of USDA foods available to TEFAP clients. The CDU will be working with partnering food banks and/or community action agencies to distribute food to underserved participants residing in remote counties or rural areas.

The state of Arkansas will enter a partnership with Eligible Recipient Agencies' (ERA) to improve the distribution and outreach of TEFAP foods. The ERA will be awarded sub grants to assist with the purchase of new transportation or replacement of aging transportation, provide improved longterm storage of TEFAP foods at both ERA facilities and distribution sites through the addition of cold and dry storage equipment, renovate facilities to increase long-term cold storage, and remodel distribution sites to increase the number of clients served.

With the distribution of sub grants to our partnering agencies, we are expected to see an increase of up to 15 percent of USDA foods served to TEFAP clients. We anticipate the funded projects will allow for greater distribution to underserved clients in counties and areas where under 40 percent of persons in poverty are served. The grant will allow partner ERA to better serve participants residing in underserved areas by increasing the amount of TEFAP foods distributed to various distribution sites.

The CDU will monitor all monthly client served reports from partnering agencies, proposed research and outreach documents, progress of activities, invoices for purchased equipment and renovations, representation at community/stakeholder meetings, and consistent communication with partnering agencies through quarterly meetings and emails. The CDU will visit partnering agencies to ensure that equipment, materials and supplies, and renovations that have been purchased or contracted are being used for the specified purpose.

The Arkansas Division of Environmental Quality requests a reallocation from Capital Outlay to Operating Expenses. The agency has received approval for this budget adjustment from the EPA Grants Specialist assigned to this grant.

This award is intended to address health outcomes from the COVID-19 pandemic by supporting enhanced monitoring of particulate matter and five other air pollutants regulated by the national ambient air quality standards under the Clean Air Act. This award provides for 100% of the cost to purchase 9 particulate monitors, 7 ozone analyzers, a trace carbon monoxide analyzer, and a trace sulfur dioxide analyzer. This is a direct grant from the United States Environmental Protection Agency funded under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. There is no cost-share requirement for the state.

Particulate Matter 2.5 (PM2.5) American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Funding

Total Amount to be Reallocated - \$33,190

The State of Arkansas, Department of Energy and Environment, Division of Environmental Quality (DEQ) is requesting the reallocation of grant funds in the amount of \$33,190 from Capital Outlay to Operating Expenses.

The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 is a \$1.9 trillion economic stimulus bill passed by the 117th United States Congress and signed into law on March 11, 2021, to aid recovery from the economic and health effects of COVID-19. ARPA funds support a broad array of programs and services that focus on public health initiatives, including those supporting the goals of the Clean Air Act related to public health and drinking water, air quality, and pollution reduction.

DEQ received ARPA funding in the amount of \$400,178 from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to advance enhanced monitoring of Particulate Matter 2.5 (PM2.5) or other National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) pollutants to better protect the health of Arkansans. More specifically, EPA awarded this funding to DEQ to purchase ambient air quality monitoring equipment for implementation in the statewide air monitoring program. This is a one-time direct grant from EPA, funded under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. There is no cost-share requirement for the state.

This one-time ARPA grant fully funded the purchase of nine (9) particulate matter monitors, seven (7) ozone analyzers, one (1) trace carbon monoxide analyzer, and one (1) trace sulfur dioxide monitor. The purchase price for this equipment totaled \$366,988.

DEQ requests that remaining funds from this grant be reallocated to Operating Expenses, in the amount of \$33,190. The reallocated funds will be used to purchase supplemental supplies for the DEQ Air Lab to be used in the statewide air monitoring program. The supplies purchased will be used in conjunction with the particulate monitors, ozone analyzers, and trace carbon monoxide analyzer that were previously purchased with funding provided from this grant. The supplies and monitors together will be used for enhanced monitoring of particulate matter and five other air pollutants regulated by the national ambient air quality standards under the Clean Air Act. DEQ has received approval for this budget adjustment from the EPA Grants Specialist assigned to this grant.

Dear Secretary Hudson,

On December 13, 2021, the Arkansas Department of Parks, Heritage and Tourism received approval from the Arkansas American Rescue Plan Act Steering Committee for the use of \$2,483,890 in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds for implementation of broadband at 27 locations within Arkansas State Parks and Arkansas Welcome Centers. On December 17, 2021, the Arkansas Legislative Council approved use of the funds.

The Department of Parks, Heritage, and Tourism, State Parks Division (State Parks), is seeking to reallocate American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding within our current total remaining appropriation of \$261,443 for Broadband Implementation for State Parks and Tourism Welcome Center. The Department has completed all projects with the previous scope of work and was able to achieve a savings of \$266,443 due to value engineering solutions associated with the projects. With these savings, our request is to reallocate this savings amount in APRA funding to further implement broadband installations within State Parks. Prioritizing campground and camping overnight experiences and continuing to build out broadband connectivity with State Parks are recommendations of the Natural State Initiative to showcase Arkansas as a premier outdoor destination. Reallocation of these savings will allow for expansion of wi-fi coverage at select campgrounds where cellular service provides minimal coverage for both emergency communications and guest experience.
