June 17, 2016

On June 17, 2016, Senator Bill Sample and Representative David Branscum, Co-Chairs of the Legislative Council and Senator Bruce Maloch and Representative David Meeks, Co-Chairs of the PEER Subcommittee received written notification from Larry Walther, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State requesting Emergency Review of Pay Plan Requests, Merit Funding, Budget Classification Transfers, Miscellaneous Federal Grants and Cash Appropriation Requests.

Under Rule 17 of the Rules of the Arkansas Legislative Council, on June 17, 2016, the Co-Chairs of the Legislative Council and PEER Subcommittee unanimously determined that emergency review of the Pay Plan Requests, Merit Funding, Budget Classification Transfers, Miscellaneous Federal Grants and Cash Appropriation Requests were necessary to enable the agencies to perform essential services and these transfers are being authorized to cover any fiscal year end shortfalls that may occur.

Below is a summary of the Pay Plan Requests, Merit Funding, Budget Classification Transfers, Miscellaneous Federal Grants and Cash Appropriation Requests that were given emergency review.

RE: Emergency Review of Year End Adjustments

Dear Co-Chairs:

I am requesting emergency review of end of year adjustments that are required to close out the 2016 Fiscal Year. Specifically, emergency review is requested for Pay Plan appropriation adjustments. Merit Funding Transfers, Budget Classification Transfers, Miscellaneous Federal Grants and Cash Fund appropriation increases.

Without the ability to process these unforeseen adjustments quickly the state payroll may be delayed, payments may be delayed to venders, and the 2016 Fiscal Year cannot be closed out to allow the 2017 Fiscal Year to be loaded into the Statewide Accounting System (AASIS).

Emergency review is requested for the following items for fiscal year-end:

- Pay Plan emergency review is requested up to the amount appropriated by the General Assembly in Act 1070 of 2015, including up to \$16,000,000 from Section 2, \$4,000,000 from Section 25, and \$4,000,000 from Section 33. The Department of Finance and Administration has a very small window of time to correct payroll issues. If there is a delay due to unforeseen appropriation constraints it could result in state payroll processing being delayed and employees not receiving their pay on the scheduled payday.
- Merit Funding Transfer emergency review is requested up to \$14,000,000 from the Merit Fund Holding Account. The Governor has approved Merit Bonuses for the employees of state of Arkansas up to 4.5% of their annual salaries. When needed, Merit Funding Transfers will be provided to agencies for the last pay period of the year to ensure a sufficient amount of funding is available.
- Budget Classification Transfers emergency review is requested to ensure sufficient appropriation is available in General Maintenance and Operating commitment items should

unanticipated expenses arise during the end of the year. These requests do not generate new appropriation but allow the agency to use the flexibility granted to them by the General Assembly to move amounts already approved by the General Assembly from one commitment item to another. The Department of Finance and Administration requests emergency review of up to \$2,000,000 in total transfers for Budget Classification Transfers.

- Miscellaneous Federal Grants review is requested to allow agencies the ability to utilize federal funding if unanticipated expenses accrue. Appropriation for Miscellaneous Federal grant requests was approved by the General Assembly in Act 1070 of 2015. The Department of Finance and Administration would limit our emergency review to \$2,000,000 in total federal appropriation for Changes to Existing Programs.
- Cash Fund appropriation increases review is requested to ensure sufficient appropriation
 for cash funded agencies if unforeseen issues arise. Appropriation of Cash Fund Holding
 Account was approved by the General Assembly in Act 1070 of 2015. The Department of
 Finance and Administration would limit emergency review to \$2,000,000 total. Without
 these adjustments payments could be delayed to venders.

We do not anticipated utilizing all of the statutorily available appropriation or merit funding allowed under the law. Appropriation and merit funding will only be given in the amounts required by each agency. These high estimates will give the Department of Finance and Administration the flexibility to process end of year closing in a timely manner.

All items processed on an emergency basis with this prior review will be reported to the next regularly scheduled PEER meeting.



RE: Cash Fund Appropriation increase FY17

Dear Mr. Baird,

The Department of Finance and Administration Management Services - Office of State Procurement (OSP) is requesting permission to increase our Cash Fund Appropriation to accommodate an External Public Procurement Consultant to provide expert advice and assistance with upcoming Department of Human Services (DHS) procurement for Dental Only Managed Care for the Division of Medical Services (DMS) agreed by both DHS and OSP.

A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the DMS and OSP which addresses the procurement of an External Public Procurement Consultant is in place. OSP will conduct the procurement pursuant to a Request for Qualifications (RFQ). OSP will make best efforts to procure an External Public Procurement Consultant qualified to provide competent expert advice and assistance with the DHS The External Public Procurement Consultant will be a person or entity widely acknowledged as being an expert in public procurement, will be able to, among other things, competently assist OSP and DHS in the planning and execution of the procurement processes; ensure that "best practices" are followed; and be available for testimony and expertise during the post-award, protest, and legislative approval phases of the solicitations.

I am requesting the addition of special commitment item 590:00:46, in Cash Funds Center 907, Fund NFA0013 in the amount of \$1,500,000, to have appropriation in place for current needs of an External Public Procurement Consultant for DHS critical procurements.

DHS will transfer the appropriate funding to DFA to fund the Cash Appropriation. The Medicaid Administration Grant will be used to supply the 50% federal portion and the remaining 50% match will be State General Revenue. First transfer is expected to be approximately \$1,500,000 for the Dental Only Managed Care procurement. A revised Certification of Income will be provided as funds are transferred so only the current amount of appropriation needed at that time will be unblocked.
