#### **JUSTIFICATION:**

The Adult Protective Services division of the Arkansas Department of Human Services is requesting a 12-month no-cost extension to complete grant activities. The grant is currently set to expire on September 30, 2024. If approved, the new end date will be September 29, 2025.

Currently, the unobligated balance of this grant totals approximately \$1,765,257.61.

During the past year, the Adult Protective Services division of the Arkansas Department of Human Services (APS) faced several challenges that impacted our project's progress and activities. One significant challenge was the delayed release of funding allocated for ARPA 1 & 2, which was not available until January 2024. Another challenge arose from the vacancy in the APS Trainer position, requiring the APS director and grant coordinator to assume dual roles to ensure staff received necessary training. This increased workload strained resources and affected training efficiency, prompting efforts to streamline processes and utilize external training resources where possible.

Additionally, the resignations of APS Director Jennifer Reynolds in early November 2022 and the APS Grant Coordinator at the end of January 2023 posed operational challenges. APS Administrator Natasha Lucas managed multiple roles during this transition, reallocating duties and delegating tasks to maintain essential functions.

Despite these challenges, APS remains committed to advancing its mission and achieving project objectives. We continue to adapt proactively, leveraging resources and partnerships to overcome obstacles and achieve measurable outcomes.

A no-cost extension would enable APS to continue achieving grant objectives by implementing the following upcoming programmatic activities.

Dear Mr. Krenn:

Due to unforeseen circumstances, SAU Tech and the Arkansas Fire Training Academy are requesting to amend the original appropriation for the Emergency Medical Training facility construction project. Our justifications to amend are below:

- 1. Former AFTA Director Woody resigned in spring 2024 and the new AFTA Director, Grant Warner, was hired effective October 1, 2024. The hiring process took away from the initial stages of pre-development and bidding process.
- 2. The original appropriation was estimated to be \$300 per sqft for construction costs. The winning bid is \$244 per sqft for construction costs. This variance allows us to expand the project from the original estimation.

Our expansion project will enhance the new facility, and the EMS program located at the AFTA. The additional items are to enhance furniture, fixtures, and classroom equipment, enhance technology for the building and indiv.idual classrooms, and to enhance security and outdoor spaces.

We respectfully request to amend the original appropriation to add enhancements to the building and campus setting as well as for additional time to complete construction until **9/30/2025**.

National Park College (NPC) respectfully submits its request for FY 2025 appropriation approval of the funds provided by the American Rescue Plan through the U.S. Department of Education. The FY 2025 revised appropriation request includes construction of a instructional welding and metalworking facility. The demand for skilled workers in these fields continues to outpace the existing available workforce in our region and across the state. With the construction of a new welding and metalworking facility NPC will be able to train more skilled workers contributing to the region's economic growth and helping to fulfill the workforce needs that have arisen. The timeline for completion of a new welding and metalworking facility will total 18 months, completing by July 2026, ahead of the December 31, 2026 grant deadline.
