AN ACT FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION - GRANTS AND AID TO LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS
AND SPECIAL PROGRAMS APPROPRIATION FOR THE 2018-2019 FISCAL YEAR.

Amendment No. ____ to Senate Bill No. 33

Amend Senate Bill No. 33 as engrossed, S2/14/18 (version: 02/14/2018 5:09:51 PM)

Page 2, line 3, delete "114,000,000" and substitute "131,000,000"

AND

Page 3, line 27, delete "\$2,982,044,821" and substitute "\$2,999,044,821"

AND

Page 19, immediately following SECTION 32, insert two new SECTIONs to read as follows:

" SECTION 33. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. RESTRICTED RESERVE FUND TRANSFER - ARKANSAS BETTER CHANCE. Effective July 2, 2018, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall transfer on his or her books and those of the State Treasurer and the Auditor of the State the sum of seventeen (\$17,000,000) from the Restricted Reserve Fund or its successor fund or fund accounts to the Department of Education - Public School Fund for the operation and administration of the Arkansas Better Chance Program.

SECTION 34. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. RESTRICTED RESERVE FUND - EDUCATIONAL SUB FUND TRANSFER. Effective July 2, 2018, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall transfer on his or her books and those of the State Treasurer and the Auditor of the State the sum of thirty-three million dollars (\$33,000,000) from the Restricted Reserve Fund or its successor fund or fund accounts to a sub fund in the Restricted Reserve Fund or its successor fund or fund accounts to be used exclusively for educational purposes. The educational purposes shall include but not be limited to; alleviating the state teacher shortage, teacher recruitment, teacher pay

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disparity, school security, a study to determine how to reduce the administrative and paperwork burden on classroom teachers and higher education expenses including but not limited to funding the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. Applicable expenses shall be at the discretion of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State."

Appropriately renumber subsequent SECTION numbers of the bill.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - GRANTS AND AID TO LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND
SPECIAL PROGRAMS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Department of
Education, to be payable from the Department of Education Public School Fund
Account, for grants and aid to local school districts and special programs of
the Department of Education for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019, the
following:

2 (A) Tutors as set out in § 6-20-2305(b)(4)(C)(i)(b)(4);

3 (B) Before-school academic programs and after-school academic

6 (C) Prekindergarten programs under § 6-20-2305(b)(4)(C)(i)(b)(3).

7 (b)(1) Set aside funds authorized in subsection (a) of this section
8 shall be distributed to school districts on a dollar for dollar matching
9 basis of school district expenditures for programs under subsection (a) of
10 this section on a pro rata basis until the available funds are exhausted.

11 (2) As used in this subsection, "pro rata basis" means providing
12 each district qualifying for additional funding in a proportionate share
13 based on how each district's expenditure bears to the total of funding
14 provided in subsection (a) of this section for all qualifying districts as
15 determined by the Department of Education.

16 (c) If any funding remains after funding subsection (b) of this
17 section, that remaining balance shall be carried over to the following fiscal
18 year for the same purposes as provided in this section.

19 (d) The Department of Education shall adopt rules as necessary to
20 implement this section.

21 (e) The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
22 ~~2017~~ 2018 through June 30, ~~2018~~ 2019.

24 SECTION 32. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
25 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. R.I.S.E.
26 ARKANSAS. The appropriation for the R.I.S.E. Arkansas line item in the
27 Grants and Aid to Local School Districts and Special Programs section of this
28 Act shall be used for the coordination of a statewide reading campaign with
29 community partners, parents, and teachers to establish the importance of
30 reading in homes, schools, and communities.

31 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
32 ~~2017~~ 2018 through June 30, ~~2018~~ 2019.

34 → SECTION 33. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
35 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
36 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
