In order to adjust salaries in accordance with A.C.A. §12-61-105 for the State Military Department, I am asking for two supplemental positions with associated appropriation for the remainder of this fiscal year in the amount of \$145,576. This appropriation will be used to increase the line item salary amount for the positions of Adjutant General and Deputy Adjutant General and shall be supplemental and in addition to the positions and appropriation provided in Sections 1 and 3 of Act 716 of 2015.

I am also requesting supplemental appropriation of \$17,000 for Court Martial Expenses. This appropriation will be used to allow the Adjutant General to perform additional court martials and shall be supplemental and in addition to the appropriation provided in Sections 6 of Act 716 of 2015.

SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 7. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the Ninetieth General Assembly, that funds provided by the General Assembly for the operations of the State Military Department are, due to unforeseen circumstances, insufficient to continue to provide essential governmental services; that the provisions of this act will provide the necessary monies for the State Military Department to continue such services; and that a delay in the effective date of this Act could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval. If this bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the veto.

The proposed integration reflects AEDC's removal of fifteen (15) salaried positions that are duplicative or unnecessary. The request also includes six (6) Extra Help positions for the start of an agency internship program. Also included are the additional amounts necessary for AEDC to increase marketing efforts both domestically and internationally, and an additional grants appropriation in order to carry out Governor Hutchinson's Military Affairs initiative. Lastly is special language that allows AEDC to purchase promotional items.

These amendments reflect the efficiencies that resulted from the Type II Transfer during the 90th Session. Further, they are part of a broader effort to realize savings and efficiencies in state government.

- 1. 
