








Historical ADC Admissions, 2010-2023






Prison Population, 2010-2024

Annual Prison Population Growth, 2010-2024






Population Projections





 Protect Arkansas Act – Increased mandatory serving time for certain violent offenders are projected to create an additional 1,500-2,000 beds needed through 2040. Highly dependent on sentences imposed, changes to plea agreements, and future crime/clearance rates.
