8:04 p.m. ASP debriefs Border Patrol on the escape information on the map. Debrief ends @ 8:05 p.m.

9:00 p.m. Command Center starts composing together copies of the map for Border Patrol.

10:25 p.m. Sgt. Wyatt starts going over google earth pro with other staff members and finishes training at about 11:30 p.m.

6-5-2025

2:52 a.m. Command Center received a call from D.D. Gaylon Lay, who was responding to the escape at Texarkana WR, reported that there was a possible sighting at a dollar store in Delight, AR.

5:02 a.m. Command Center received a call from dispatch that while walking they heard a door close from a unoccupied house. State Police and Izard Co. are headed that way (250 Gray Ln)

5:08 a.m. Sohns and Hoskins are being set up at the Methodist church to get a good vantage point of the area.

5:14 a.m. Capt. Brandon informed the command center that the incident turned out to be nothing.

7:33 a.m. DW Bolden start the planned meeting to discuss the timelines of all agencies to make a coeisive timeline to see what the next step are.

Timeline – 5/28 grid search north to prison. Discovered a cell phone and I'M Hardin's badge. (Day 1)

5/29 – ASP cleared several caves in the area, down old Dolph rd by powerlines. 4 caves just S of Hwy 5. Multiple houses cleared, and there was a heat signature of 213, but not verified as human.

6/1- Lt. Maples cleared the area by the Hwy and the prison, cleared Driftwood Dr, area behind the air strip, spoke with houses in the area to see if they had any game cameras, security cameras and outbuildings.

6/4 Hwy 253/ Driftwood Dr, along the power lines, Moccasin Creek, ASP cleared Hwy 5, 249, and Hopewell Hollow Rd. and Grey Squirrel Ln. Started first clearing with 4 wheelers and side by sides. Second clearing on foot.

Lt. Cross asks once timeline complete and per DW Bolden, would like a packet for all agencies. DW Bolden advising all phone calls, interviews, all leads checked on thoroughly. No solid information saying he has left or that he is in the area. Lt. Cross is sending digital map for U.S. Marshals.

ASP has 6 to 7 officers here to help in anyway they can and the drone is available. Lt. Maples advised that they have four wheelers and side by sides with portable drone for quick use. Lt. Hubbard advised that the ERT team is available until Friday afternoon and is dialed back to patrolling and responding to calls. U.S. Marshals advise that there is not a house or out building that has not been searched within a 5 mile radius. Rail road tracks have been searched, all people seen have been interviewed and given the contact information for tips and help. Border patrol's global team will be here starting tonight with military grade helicopters and drones. Marshal's team are going to search a house and outbuilding that residents are not currently occupying. There have not been any calls regarding thefts of cars, trucks, boats, side by sides, etc. Lt. Maples advised that there was a residence on the river, however, they are not aware of their inventory and cannot confirm or deny if anything is missing. Lt. Maples also advised that they have informed their teams to keep an eye on the number of campers and to report immediately if you see an extra individual that matches the description of Inmate Hardin. The Brother-in-Law, of Inmate Hardin, does not like Inmate Hardin, and advised that if there were any contact between Inmate Hardin and his wife, who is Inmate Hardin's Sister, he would report it immediately.

Law Enforcement has spoken with Inmate Hardin's wife and parents. There is suspicion that Inmate Hardin will try to contact his mother as soon as he gets the opportunity. The possibility of Inmate Hardin being deceased is also likely. If he is deceased, only the cadaver dog will be able to locate him. Posts are advised to look for signs of decomposition and decay, while searching on foot, for example: buzzards in the air. Rock overhangs have been searched and there were no signs of fresh inhabitance. Possibility to re-check areas, due to getting pressured and feeling the need to move. AR Game and Fish have searched the water on boats with no leads on Inmate Hardin. Inmate Hardin made notes on stride and how long it would take him to travel. Per Inmate Hardin's notes, he could move at approximately three miles an hour. With Inmate Hardin having roughly an hour head start he could have covered a lot of distance. An ASP Sergeant advised he can get with the AR Game and Fish to talk about patrolling up and down the riverbanks for signs of a body and to clear any structures. Bull Shoals and Norfork, currently have the flood gates open, so it may be difficult to see if a body is stuck in a thick vegetation area. Lt. Maples has been in light contact with the river outfitters but can talk to them more in depth on floating. Law Enforcement is working on obtaining a warrant to access Inmate Hardin's financial accounts. Discussed the roadblock with ACC to start checking both North and South bound traffic, while still in the area. There was an officer in an off-duty vehicle on Moccasin Creek running tags. The Command Center was informed that the Inmate interviewed at ORCU, stated that Inmate Hardin told him that he planned to escape by river transportation using a raft made from milk jugs. Baxter Co. advised that they had received very few tips on Inmate Hardin. The Inmate interview was from when Inmate was at ORCU four years ago. Hardin would have had access to recycling and all milk jugs from the maintenance room by the back dock. If Inmate Hardin had help he could have stashed items in that area. There were no cameras behind the ICC garage, so we are unable to verify what he may have had, when he left into the woods. A cabin on Chesmond Ferry Rd. has lots of buzzards circling above. Izard Co. Sheriff's Office has a deputy headed to location. Sheriff Melton has made arrangements with the Calico Rock School District to hold any meetings for larger groups during this time. Meeting is adjourned.

Dickie advises that he has pictures and shows pictures of Inmate Hardin and the campsite he made.

Border Patrol stated that Inmate Hardin said he got water out of the Moccasin Creek and ate berries and ants. Jamie advised that ASP will interview Inmate Hardin at the Varner Super Max Unit. Dickie Johnson states that everyone did a job well done. Warden Hurst thanks all agencies involved.

On Wednesday June 25, 2025, I interviewed Christopher Brandon. Brandon is identified as a Captain at the ADC North Central Unit. The below interview summary is not intended to be a verbatim account and does not memorialize all statements made during the interview. Communications by the parties in the interview were electronically recorded. A copy of the recording will be included in the case file.

Brandon advised that on May 25, 2025, he was on duty at the North Central Unit when it was suspected that Grant Hardin had escaped. Brandon said that he ordered a roster count and notified Warden Thomas Hurst of the situation in person. Brandon said that he watched the security footage and observed Hardin walk out the sally port gate. Brandon advised that when he confirmed that Hardin escaped, he ordered Corporal Nathan Williams to call Sergeant Delgado to get the Emergency Response Team on the way and also ordered Williams to begin making notifications from the notification manual. Brandon said that Hurst told Brandon to open the command center while Hurst began making phone calls. Brandon said that when Lieutenant Robert Cross arrived, he asked if the notifications had been made. Brandon then asked Hurst, to which Hurst replied "yes." Brandon said that Cross assigned someone to begin notifying the local residents of the escape. Brandon said that he called Williams to the command center to be a scribe, forgetting that he had assigned Williams to make notifications. Brandon acknowledged communication failures were a major factor in notifications not being made. Brandon said that when representatives from law enforcement agencies began showing up, he assumed the notifications had been made. Brandon said that it was a day or two later when it was discovered that the local law enforcement agencies weren't notified. Brandon stated "looking back now and dissecting it, I think the agencies notified each other, it was word of mouth."

On Friday June 27, 2025, I interviewed Lindsay Wallace. Wallace is identified as the Secretary of the Arkansas Department of Corrections. The below is an interview summary, it is not intended to be a verbatim account and does not memorialize all statements made during the interview. Communications by the parties in the interview were electronically recorded. A copy of the recording will be included in the case file.

Wallace advised that there are 3 levels of Directives as follows:

Secretarial Directives

Administrative Directives

Unit Directives

Wallace said that the goal is for lower level directives to avoid conflict with the upper level directives. Wallace said that secretarial and administrative directives are reviewed on an annual basis but her office does not review unit level directives.

Wallace said that she was unaware that the North Central Unit had changed their policy to reflect that the Pine Bluff Radio Room would notify local law enforcement agencies and that from her conversations with Director Dexter Payne, the NCU should have notified local law enforcement. Wallace said that Warden Thomas Hurst would have been responsible for knowing that the NCU policy conflicted with administrative policy, as the policy wasn't reviewed by anyone with higher authority. When asked if she had recommendations to fix the issue of conflicting policies, Wallace said that it would be helpful to have a position that is dedicated solely to policy. Wallace said that it would be helpful to have someone who is continuously reviewing all three levels of directives to make sure there aren't conflicts between the three, or with state law. Wallace also said that the Command Center at NCU seemed "disjointed," as there were three rooms where communication was taking place and it seemed that there were breakdowns in communication between the three rooms. Wallace explained that people were in the Warden's office, people were in the main command center room, and people were in another room that contained mostly external law enforcement representatives. Wallace said that information was being shared between the three rooms but it didn't seem to flow smoothly.
