9 SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EMERGENCY 10 GRANTS & EXTRA HELP POOL. An Institution of higher education that suffers an 11 emergency/disaster event resulting in all or a significant portion of campus 12 operations being interrupted, may request disaster assistance through the 13 14 Arkansas Department of Higher Education. Upon the declaration of an 15 emergency by the Governor, the institution may request, subject to the 16 recommendation of the Director of the Department of Higher Education and approval of the Governor, a grant from the Disaster Relief Fund to assist in 17 returning that campus to operation and/or to a sister campus providing 18 services to the students from the affected campus. Certified law enforcement 19 officers employed by an institution of higher education may be granted 20 jurisdiction at the sister institution, upon agreement of both institutions. 21 The Department of Higher Education is authorized a pool of 500 extra help 22 23 positions for use in such emergency situations. These positions may be assigned to the campus suffering the disaster event or to a sister campus 24 providing services to the students from the affected campus. The Governor 25 may waive the 1,500 hour limit of ACA 6-63-314 on these assigned extra help 26 27 pool positions.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 29 <u>2010</u> 2011 through June 30, 2011 2012.

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SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
 REALLOCATION OF RESOURCES FOR INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION. Upon
 determination by the president or chancellor of an institution of higher
 education that a reallocation of resources for purposes of reorganization or
 consolidation of administrative functions within the institution is necessary

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for efficient and effective operations of the institution, the president or 1 2 chancellor, with approval of the institution's board of trustees, may have the authority to transfer positions, appropriations and related funds between 3 campuses, divisions, branches, and other budgetary units of the institution, 4 after receiving prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget 5 Committee. The transfers of positions, programs, or activities shall be used 6 for those purposes for which the appropriations were approved by the General 7 Assembly. The transfers, consolidations, or reorganizations which involve 8 academic programs shall be reviewed by the Department of Higher Education 9 prior to submission to the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee. 10 Provided, however, that the institution shall be limited to submitting no 11 12 more than two (2) individual transaction transfer requests during any fiscal year and shall be further limited to no more than five percent (5%) of the 13 14 total General Revenue and Special Revenue appropriation, funding, positions 15 specific to each institution, and no Tobacco Settlement funds or 16 appropriations may be reallocated pursuant to this section. Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 17 appropriation and general revenue funding for institutions of higher 18 education each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This 19 is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation 20 act(s) for institutions of higher education and the general revenue 21 allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the 22 Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that 23 institutions of higher education may operate more efficiently if some 24 flexibility is provided to institutions of higher education authorizing broad 25 powers under this Section. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate 26 that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of 27 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this 28 section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint 29 Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement 30 of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled 31 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is 32 33 void.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2010 2011 through June 30, 2011 2012.

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SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 1 2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. LOANS. In order to provide timely payments under financial aid appropriations made in 3 this Act, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State is authorized to provide 4 loans from the Budget Stabilization Trust Fund to make available all funds 5 attributable to the financial aid programs under the then current official 6 revenue estimates. In the event of an unanticipated state revenue shortfall, 7 8 any such loans remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall be repaid from revenues distributed in the first two months of the next fiscal year. Funds 9 for appropriations made in this Act for purposes other than financial aid 10 shall not be affected by the application of this provision. 11

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
2010 2011 through June 30, 2011 2012.

SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 15 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. WORK 16 FORCE 2000 DEVELOPMENT FUND PROCEDURES. After the amounts to be made 17 available to the various technical colleges have been determined as set out 18 in Arkansas Code 26-51-205(d)(2), such documents as may be necessary shall be 19 processed so that funds may be transferred from the Work Force 2000 20 Development Fund to the State Treasury fund or fund account from which the 21 22 technical college draws its general revenue support. Such funds as may be transferred shall not exceed 93.691% of the total funds available from the 23 24 Work Force 2000 Development Fund during the fiscal year.

In the event that a technical institute or comprehensive lifelong learning 25 center which receives support from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund as 26 27 determined by law transfers or merges into the Arkansas Technical College and Community College System for which Work Force 2000 Development Fund monies 28 are determined by law, then the actual amount of support from the Work Force 29 2000 Development Fund in the preceding fiscal year for such educational 30 institution shall be made available irrespective of any other provision of 31 32 law which sets out maximum levels of support from such fund.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2010 2011 through June 30, 2011 2012.

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SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

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1 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BUILDING 2 MAINTENANCE FUND. After the sum of \$13,200,000 has been deposited into the 3 Higher Education Building Maintenance Fund, the next \$10,000,000 or so much 4 as is collected, is to be transferred to the Research Development Fund there 5 to be used as provided by law.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,<del>2010</del>
<u>2011</u> through June 30, <del>2011</del> <u>2012</u>.

33 The General Assembly has determined that the institution in this act 34 could be operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution and that flexibility is being accomplished by providing authority 35 to transfer between items of appropriation made by this act. Since the 36

1 General Assembly has granted the institution broad powers under the transfer 2 of appropriations, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the utilization of the transfers by requiring 3 prior approval of the Legislative Council in the utilization of the transfer 4 5 authority. Therefore, the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by 6 the Legislative Council is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent 7 jurisdiction, this entire section is void. 8

9 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
10 2010 2011 through June 30, 2011 2012.

12 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 13 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 14 POSITIONS. (a) Nothing in this act shall be construed as a commitment of the State of Arkansas or any of its agencies or institutions to continue funding 15 any position paid from the proceeds of the Tobacco Settlement in the event 16 17 that Tobacco Settlement funds are not sufficient to finance the position. (b) State funds will not be used to replace Tobacco Settlement funds when 18 such funds expire, unless appropriated by the General Assembly and authorized 19 20 by the Governor.

(c) A disclosure of the language contained in (a) and (b) of this Section shall be made available to all new hire and current positions paid from the proceeds of the Tobacco Settlement by the Tobacco Settlement Commission. (d) Whenever applicable the information contained in (a) and (b) of this Section shall be included in the employee handbook and/or Professional Services Contract paid from the proceeds of the Tobacco Settlement.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,

SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 11 12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TUITION REIMBURSEMENT. SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL 21 22 ALLOWANCES. For the purpose of providing necessary allowances for housing and other unusual expenses incurred by or in behalf of the athletic director, 23 24 assistant athletic directors, head coaches, and assistant coaches at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock, the Board of Trustees may make special 25 allowances available therefor in such amounts as the Board of Trustees may 26 determine as justified, an equitable allowance in view of the unusual and 27 exacting duties of said athletic director, assistant athletic directors, head 28 29 coaches, and assistant coaches, and for the purpose of providing such allowances, the Board of Trustees is authorized to expend from the auxiliary 30 income of the University of Arkansas at Little Rock, which is derived from 31 athletic event receipts, an amount not to exceed twenty thousand dollars 32 (\$20,000) in the aggregate for such purposes during each fiscal year for the 33 athletic director and head coaches, and ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) in the 34 aggregate for such purposes during each fiscal year for the assistant 35 athletic directors and assistant coaches. Provided that any such allowances 36

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1 shall be in addition to the regular salary of such athletic director, assistant athletic directors, head coaches and assistant coaches, as 2 established herein provided that the amount of such allowance shall not 3 4 exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per annum for any one salaried position. Further, if the special allowance funds authorized herein are 5 utilized the University of Arkansas at Little Rock shall report annually to 6 the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee the exact disposition of those 7 8 special allowances funds.

12 SECTION 7. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS.
