The institution encourages curricular or cocurricular activities that prepare students for informed citizenship and workplace success. 2. The institution's processes and activities demonstrate inclusive and equitable treatment of diverse populations. 3. The institution fosters a climate of respect among all students, faculty, staff and administrators from a range of diverse backgrounds, ideas and perspectives. Core component 3.B. 3. The education offered by the institution recognizes the human and cultural diversity and provides students with growth opportunities and lifelong skills to live and work in a multicultural world. 3.C. The institution has the faculty and staff needed for effective, high-quality programs and student services. 1.
