

**HANDOUT C-6 UALR****U.A. at Little Rock Police Department**

Bullet point summary of the police department:

- The department has 29 police officers that includes the detective, lieutenants, assistant chiefs and chief.
- The department has 11 unarm security officers that assist in none emergency calls of service and campus property patrol. Also serve as A.C.I.C certified dispatchers.
- The department runs 24/7 and broken into three shifts to maintain continuous law enforcement service.
- The department is broken into Patrol Division, Support Service and Investigative Division, Auxiliary Division, and Communication.
- The department jurisdiction is U.A. at Little Rock (main campus), William H. Bowen Law School, Clinton School of Public Service and Benton Center.
- The campus has Rave Mobility that is able communicate emergency (manmade or natural) through email, text, voice (phone or cell) to students, faculty or staff.
- The department follows by law the Clery Act (reporting of crime statistics) and the Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act of 2013 (compile statistics for incidents of dating violence, domestic violence, stalking, and sexual assault).
- The department is involved in Prescription Drug Take Back Program, does active shooter survival training to the campus community and is currently providing Rape Aggression Defense training to the campus community and outside entities.
- The department promotes Safe College online program that provides personal safety training through the campus Human Resource Office to the campus community.

- The department personnel does training, attend law enforcement associations and have partnerships with other law enforcement and security agencies. Some examples of training: send officers to Criminal Justice Institute, Federal Law Enforcement Training Center in state classes, and Arkansas Law Enforcement Training Academy. Some example of associations the department attends: joined Metro Campus Law Enforcement/Security, attend International Association of Campus Law Enforcement Administrators meeting and joined Arkansas Association of Police Chiefs. Some example of partnerships hosted VALOR (Bureau of Justice Assistance) programs, do some safety programs with the security department at Baptist College, and host Law Enforcement Active Shooter Emergency Response (LASER) training led by instructors from National Center for Biomedical research and Training at Louisiana State University. \*The department will be working with Pulaski County Sheriff to do this training again in July of this year\*.
- U.A. at Little Rock has been named the safest campus of the state by 2018's Safest College Campus by State study.
