<u>Description</u>: Act 586 of 2021 amended the laws pertaining to administrative hearing procedures for state taxes and the procedures for taxpayer judicial relief through the creation of the Independent Tax Appeals Commission. The purpose of Act 586 is to establish an independent tribunal with tax expertise to resolve disputes between the Department of Finance and Administration and taxpayers. The Tax Appeals Commission is created as part of the Department of Inspector General.

Pursuant to Act 586, three Commissioners were appointed by July 1, 2022. The Tax Appeals Commission is responsible for promulgating new rules to carry out the intent and purpose of the Act, and the final rules are to be filed with the Secretary of State on or before December 1, 2022. Initial hearings will begin no later than January 1, 2023.

<u>Status</u>: The Tax Appeals Commission has completed the draft rules. The administrative rules were submitted to BLR on October 13, 2022 and to the Secretary of State on October 14, 2022. Public notice was printed in the Arkansas Democrat Gazette on October 14, 15, and 16, 2022. A public hearing is set for November 10, 2022, at 1:30 p.m. in the conference room of the state library on the second floor at 900 W. Capitol, Little Rock, AR.
