SUBJECT: PAYMENT OF	DEATH BENEFIT		

## I. <u>AUTHORITY</u>:

The authority to promulgate this rule is vested in Section 47 of Act 203 of 2022, Fiscal Session, found in special language, now codified at A.C.A. § 12-27-150.

## II. <u>PURPOSE</u>:

To establish criteria for the payment of a death benefit from special revenues held by the Department of Corrections or its various divisions to any department Employee killed in the line of duty.

## III. <u>APPLICABILITY</u>:

All Employees of the Department of Corrections.

#### IV. <u>DEFINITIONS</u>:

- A. <u>Beneficiary</u>: a designated recipient, other than the Employee, including the Employee's spouse or the surviving child of the Employee if there is no surviving spouse. If there is more than one (1) surviving child of the Employee, the death benefit will be split equally amongst all designated surviving children.
- B. <u>Board</u>: the Board of Corrections.
- C. <u>Department</u>: the Department of Corrections.
- D. <u>Director</u>: the executive head of a Division, Board, Commission, or Section of the Department; the Chief of Staff is designated as the executive head of Shared Services for purposes of this rule; and the Compliance Administrator is designated as the executive head of the Compliance Division for purposes of this rule.
- E. <u>Employee</u>: any person employed in a full-time or part-time capacity by the Department of Corrections, including any Division, Board or Commission of the Department.
- F. In the line of duty: refers to activities related to an Employee's official job responsibilities.
- G. Secretary: the Secretary of the Department of Corrections.

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# V. <u>POLICY</u>:

It shall be the policy of the Board of Corrections to provide a death benefit not to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for any Department Employee killed in the line of duty in accordance with guidelines set out in this Rule.

# VI. <u>PROCEDURES</u>:

## A. Director Request:

- 1. A Director may submit a request to the Secretary for consideration of payment of a death benefit for any Employee who loses his or her life in the line of duty.
- 2. If the Secretary determines that an Employee is eligible to receive payment of a death benefit, the Chief Financial Officer of the Department must certify availability of funds and determine the source of funding.
- 3. The Secretary will submit a request to the Board outlining the circumstances surrounding the request for payment of a death benefit, including the possible funding source if the request is granted.
- 4. The document submitted to the Board should contain sufficient information to advise the board how the loss of life was related to performance of official job responsibilities.
- B. Payment of Death Benefit:
  - 1. Upon approval by the Board of Corrections, the Chief Financial Officer of the Department shall cause to be issued a payment to the beneficiary of an Employee who lost his or her life in the line of duty.
  - 2. The amount of payment shall be set by the Board of Corrections and shall not exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000).

## VIII. <u>IMPLEMENTATION</u>:

The Secretary of Corrections may issue directives to implement the guidance contained within this Rule.

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15 SECTION 44. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 16 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY 17 FORWARD - ENERGY, MAINTENANCE & OPERATIONAL SAVINGS. Any unexpended balance 18 of funds authorized in this Act for guaranteed energy, maintenance, and 19 operational savings generated through energy usage, solar power, waste 20 management, water conservation, and similar efficiency efforts on June 30 21 2022 2023 shall be carried forward and made available for the same purpose 22 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023 2024. Any realized savings and 23 expenditures shall be reported to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint 24 Budget Committee no later than thirty (30) days prior to the time the Agency 25 presents its budget request to the Legislative Council/Joint Budget 26 Committee. This authority authorizes the reinvestment of guaranteed savings 27 for future and existing energy conservation projects.

28 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
29 <u>2021</u> <u>2022</u> through June 30, <u>2022</u> <u>2023</u>.

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SECTION 45. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER OF FUNDS. The Arkansas Department of Corrections shall provide funding each year in an amount not to exceed \$100,000 for a Deputy Prosecuting Attorney who will be assigned to handle the prosecution of offenses occurring at the Arkansas Department of Corrections. Upon request by

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1	the Auditor of the State, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall
2	transfer an amount not to exceed \$100,000 from an account designated by the
3	Secretary of the Department of Corrections to the State Central Services Fund
4	as a direct revenue to fund a Deputy Prosecuting Attorney who will be
5	assigned to handle the prosecution of offenses occurring at the Arkansas
6	Department of Corrections.
7	The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
8	<del>2021</del> <u>2022</u> through June 30, <del>2022</del> <u>2023</u> .
9	
10	SECTION 46. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
11	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SHARED
12	SERVICES. (a)(1) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State may create a Shared
13	Services paying accounts on his or her books and on the books of the
14	Treasurer of State and the Auditor of State for the payment of personal
15	services and operating expenses in the Shared Services Paying Account
16	Appropriation by the Department of Corrections.
17	(2) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall direct the transfer
18	of funds and appropriations to the Shared Services Paying Account
19	appropriation section of this act on the books of the Treasurer of State, the
20	Auditor of State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State.
21	(3) The transfer authority provided to the department in
22	subdivision (a)(2) of this section may be used to make transfers only within
23	the department's appropriation act or between other appropriation acts
24	authorized for the department.
25	(4) The provisions of this section shall be in effect from the
26	date of passage through June 30, 2023.
27	
28	SECTION 47. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Arkansas Code Title 12, Chapter 27,
29	Subchapter 1, is amended to add an additional section to read as follows:
30	<u>12-27-150. Death benefit.</u>
31	(a) Subject to the approval of the Board of Corrections, the Secretary
32	of the Department of Corrections may authorize the payment of a death benefit
33	from special revenues held by the Department of Corrections or its various
34	divisions to any department employee killed in the line of duty.
35	(b) The amount of the death benefit shall not exceed five thousand
36	<u>dollars (\$5,000).</u>

1	(c) The secretary shall promulgate any rules necessary to implement
2	this section.
3	(d) Funds distributed under this section are subject to audit by
4	Arkansas Legislative Audit.
5	
6	SECTION 48. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
7	authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
8	and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
9	the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
10	Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
11	Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
12	control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
13	the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
14	strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.
15	
16	SECTION 49. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
17	Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
18	contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
19	which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
20	Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
21	manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
22	summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
23	Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
24	
25	SECTION 50. EFFECTIVE DATE. This act is effective on and after July 1,
26	<u>2022.</u>
