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## ARKANSAS INSURANCE DEPARTMENT Act 595 Monthly Status Report

I. The following Acts from the 2023 legislative session require rulemaking and were included in the Report on the Acts of the 2023 Regular Session Requiring New Rulemaking. The Arkansas Insurance Department ("AID") will be taking the following rulemaking actions for these Acts:

Act 580	Establishment of Audit Processes Concerning Qualified Payment Amounts for No Surprises Act	69	This Rule is issued pursuant to the authority granted the Arkansas Insurance Commissioner ("Commissioner") under Ark. Code Ann. § 23-61-108(b)(1) to promulgate rules necessary for the effective regulation of the business of insurance and as required for this State to be in compliance with federal laws, namely the No Surprises Act (NSA) of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, Pub. L. No. 116-120, and Act 580 of 2023, codified as A.C.A. §23-66-216. The Rule established an audit process as required by Act 580 of 2023, as codified at A.C.A. sec. 23-66-216.  Status: Rule will become effective on January 15, 2024.	Adopt New Rule
Act 876	Authorization of Off-Label Use of Drug Treatments for Pediatric Acute-Onset and Autoimmune Neuropsychiatric Syndrome	127	Act 876 of 2023 amended Ark. Code Ann. §23-79-1905 to broaden and clarify coverage for drug treatments for pediatric acute-onset neuropsychiatric syndrome ("PANS"), and pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infection ('PANDAS") and requires Insurance Department to promulgate a rule to this effect, including the establishment of treatment protocols for	Amend Rule

However*, AID believes rulemaking is needed for the operation of the laws and will be taking the following rulemaking actions for this Act:

Act 302	Pharmacy Benefits Manager Regulation	118	This existing rule will be amended to clarify that it applies to healthcare benefit plans that service Arkansas residents, regardless of where the payor is located, and to include new statutory penalties.  Status: Awaiting Governor's Office approval.	Amend Rule
