# DEPARTMENT OF TRANSFORMATION AND SHARED SERVICES EMPLOYEE BENEFITS DIVISIONS RULES GOVERNING VOLUNTARY PRODUCTS Effective:

# 1.0 <u>AUTHORITY</u>

- 1.01 <u>These rules shall be known as the Department of Transformation and Shared</u> Services Employee Benefits Division Rules Governing Voluntary Products.
- 1.02 These rules are promulgated pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 21-5-905 and Ark. Code Ann. § 25-15-201 *et seq.*

### 2.0 <u>PURPOSE</u>

The purpose of these rules is to implement Ark. Code Ann. § 21-5-904 regarding the administration of voluntary products.

#### 3.0 **DEFINITIONS**

- 3.01 <u>EBD means the Department of Transformation and Shared Services, Employee</u> <u>Benefits Division.</u>
- 3.02 <u>Voluntary Products means any individual or group policy and other employee</u> benefits that are wholly paid for by the employee, including without limitation those policies and benefits provided by the Arkansas State Employees Association, Inc., or a designee of the Arkansas State Employees Association, Inc., that develops and administers a cafeteria plan under Ark. Code Ann. § 21-5-405(d).

# 4.0 VOLUNTARY PRODUCTS OFFERINGS

- 4.01 <u>All state employees who are eligible under Ark. Code Ann. § 21-5-901</u> shall be offered the opportunity to participate in a cafeteria plan for Voluntary Products during their new hire eligibility period and during the annual open enrollment.
- 4.02 <u>The Arkansas State Employees Association, Inc., shall offer education and</u> information to each employee regarding the available Voluntary Products annually during open enrollment and to new hires throughout the year.

# 5.0 VOLUNTARY PRODUCTS CONTRACTS

- 5.01 <u>The Arkansas State Employees Association, Inc., shall develop and administer a</u> cafeteria plan for Voluntary Products on behalf of eligible state employees.
- 5.02 <u>All Voluntary Products shall be contracted through a competitive sealed bidding</u> <u>process.</u>

- 5.02.1 <u>The Arkansas State Employees Association, Inc., shall ensure the selection</u> of Voluntary Products offer the best combination of benefits and pricing <u>available.</u>
- 5.02.2 <u>The Arkansas State Employees Association, Inc., shall provide EBD a</u> report of all competitive bids including the procedures followed and selection process.
- 5.02.3 <u>No Voluntary Product contract, including amendments and extensions, shall</u> <u>exceed seven (7) years without being competitively rebid.</u>
- 5.03 <u>The Arkansas State Employees Association, Inc., shall present all new contracts</u> and amendments to existing contracts for Voluntary Products to the State Board of Finance and the Employee Benefits Oversight Subcommittee of the Arkansas Legislative Council.
- 5.04 <u>Any material changes to Voluntary Products contracts shall be reported to the State</u> <u>Board of Finance and the Employee Benefits Oversight Subcommittee of the</u> <u>Arkansas Legislative Council.</u>

## 6.0 <u>COORDINATION WITH THE EMPLOYEE BENEFITS DIVISION</u>

- 6.01 <u>To ensure continuity of service to state employees, the Arkansas State Employees</u> <u>Association, Inc., shall coordinate with the EBD on issues regarding, but not limited</u> to billing, employee management, record keeping, and information sharing.
- 6.02 <u>The Arkansas State Employees Association, Inc., shall meet with the EBD</u> quarterly.
- 6.03 The State Board of Finance shall resolve any disputes between the Arkansas State Employees Association, Inc. and EBD regarding voluntary products. These disputes shall be exempt from the Administrative Procedures Act, Ark. Code Ann. § 25-15-201 et seq.

## 7.0 <u>SEMI-ANNUAL REPORTING</u>

- 7.01 <u>The Arkansas State Employees Association, Inc., shall submit to the Employee</u> <u>Benefits Oversight Subcommittee of the Arkansas Legislative Council a semi-</u> <u>annual report that includes:</u>
  - 7.01.1 <u>A summary of the Voluntary Products offerings, including the contract,</u> pricing, and number of participants for each offering; and
  - 7.01.2 <u>A financial analysis report for each offering, including premiums paid by</u> state employees and additional fees and expenses, if any.

Arkansas Code § 21-5-407(19), concerning the definition of 24 25 "vendor" under the State and Public School Life and Health Insurance Program, 26 is amended to read as follows: 27 (19)(A) "Vendor" means a corporation, partnership, or other 28 organization that is: 29 (A)(i) Licensed to do business and in good standing 30 with the State of Arkansas; and 31 (B)(ii) Lawfully engaged in administering employer-32 funded or employee-funded benefit plans for employer groups in consideration 33 of an administration fee. 34 (B) "Vendor" does not include the Arkansas State Employees 35 Association, Inc., or a designee of the Arkansas State Employees Association, Inc., that develops and administers a cafeteria plan under § 21-5-405(d). 36

Arkansas Code § 21-5-424, concerning the State Employee 13 Health Benefit Advisory Commission, is amended to add an additional 14 subsection to read as follows: 15 (g) The Arkansas State Employees Association, Inc., or a designee of the Arkansas State Employees Association, Inc., that develops and administers 16 17 a cafeteria plan under § 21-5-405(d) shall provide the commission with an 18 annual report of voluntary products to be offered to state employees during 19 open enrollment. 20 SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 21-5-901, concerning definitions used in 21 22 reference to administration of cafeteria plans offered to public officers and 23 employees, is amended to add an additional subdivision to read as follows: (5) "Voluntary product" means any individual or group policy and 24 25 other employee benefits that are wholly paid for by the employee, including without limitation those policies and benefits procured under § 6-17-1115 or 26 27 provided by the Arkansas State Employees Association, Inc., or a designee of the Arkansas State Employees Association, Inc., that develops and administers 28 29 a cafeteria plan under § 21-5-405(d). 30 31 SECTION 8. Arkansas Code § 21-5-902(a), concerning the ability of an eligible employee to enter into a salary reduction agreement to participate 32 33 in a cafeteria plan offered to public officers and employees, is amended to read as follows: 34 (a) Any eligible employee who chooses to participate in a cafeteria 35 36 plan or a voluntary product may enter into a salary reduction agreement with

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     the governmental entity.
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           SECTION 9. Arkansas Code § 21-5-904(a), concerning the administration
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     of cafeteria plans by the Director of the Employee Benefits Division, is
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     amended to read as follows:
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           (a) The Director of the Employee Benefits Division shall have
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     administrative responsibility for developing, implementing, and maintaining
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     cafeteria plans on behalf of state employees and may promulgate necessary
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     rules as he or she deems necessary to carry out the provision of this
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     section.
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           SECTION 10. Arkansas Code § 21-5-904, concerning the administration of
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     cafeteria plans offered to public officers and employees, is amended to add
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     an additional subsection to read as follows:
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           (d) The Arkansas State Employees Association, Inc., shall:
                 (1) Develop and administer a cafeteria plan for voluntary
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     products on behalf <u>of eligible state employees; or</u>
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                 (2) Contract by a competitive sealed bidding process with a
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     designee to develop and administer a cafeteria plan for voluntary products on
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     behalf of eligible state employees.
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           SECTION 11. Arkansas Code Title 21, Chapter 5, Subchapter 9, is
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     amended to add an additional section to read as follows:
           21-5-905. Rules.
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           The Employee Benefits Division shall promulgate rules to administer
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     this subchapter.
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           SECTION 12. TEMPORARY LANGUAGE. DO NOT CODIFY. Rules.
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           (a) The Employee Benefits Division shall promulgate rules necessary to
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     implement this act.
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           (b)(1) When adopting the initial rules to implement this act, the
     final rule shall be filed with the Secretary of State for adoption under §
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     25-15-204(f):
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                       (A) On or before January 1, 2024; or
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                       (B) If approval under § 10-3-309 has not occurred by
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     January 1, 2024, as soon as practicable after approval under § 10-3-309.
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1	(2) The division shall file the proposed rule with the
2	Legislative Council under § 10-3-309(c) sufficiently in advance of January 1,
3	2024, so that the Legislative Council may consider the rule for approval
4	before January 1, 2024.
