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1	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
2	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that in order to become a licensed
3	optometrist in the State of Arkansas, optometrists who are licensed in other
4	states must retake examinations if the optometrist has not taken all parts of
5	the examination since 1997, which causes a delay in licensure and places a
6	barrier on optometrists moving into the state; that licensure by endorsement
7	authorizes the State Board of Optometry to license individuals with
8	optometrist licenses in other states quickly and easily; that other states
9	offer reciprocity to optometrists licensed in Arkansas through licensure by
10	endorsement; and that this act is immediately necessary to ensure that
11	optometric practices are performed within the State of Arkansas with a
12	license issued by the State Board of Optometry, to bring Arkansas laws
13	regarding reciprocity of optometrists as quickly as possible, and to increase
14	health care access to optometric services for the citizens of the State of
15	Arkansas. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being
16	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and
17	safety shall become effective on:
18	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
1 9	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
20	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
21	bill: or
22	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
