#### Proposed New Rule

Section 2.67 Small Brewery Tap Room - Application. An Arkansas Small Brewery permittee shall complete an application for a small brewery tap room. The same posting, publication, and notice requirements of applicants for a retail beer permit shall apply to small brewery tap room applicants. Small Brewery permittees shall designate a managing agent for each small brewery tap room and permittees shall notify the Alcoholic Beverage Control of any change in the managing agent. The managing agent shall either live in the same county as the location of the tap room or within thirty five (35) miles of the tap room. Upon submission to the ABC of the required application and completion of the posting, publication, and notice requirements, the Director of the ABC may issue an endorsement to the Small Brewery Permittee for the operation of a Small Brewery Tap Room. The endorsement shall be posted on the premises of the tap room in compliance with the specifications set forth in Section 1.37. If the Director refuses to issue the Small Brewery Tap Room endorsement to the Small Brewery permittee, the Director's decision may be appealed to the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board pursuant to Section 1.51.

#### LEGAL NOTICE

In compliance with the Administrative Procedure Act of the State of Arkansas (Act 434 of 1967), notice is hereby given that the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board proposes to promulgate regulations concerning the alcoholic beverage industry in Arkansas.

The Board will consider regulations in the following areas: grocery store wine permit application procedures, retailer loyalty programs, non-alcoholic merchandise sold by retail liquor stores, prohibited gifts and services to retailers by wholesalers and manufacturers, small brewery off-site tap rooms, small brewery off-site brewing facilities, microbrewery restaurant off-site brewing facilities, local ordinance required for private club applications and other private club-related permit transactions.

The regulation hearing will be held on September 20, 2017 at the hour of 8:30 a.m., in the fifth floor conference room, 1515 West Seventh Street, Little Rock, Arkansas.

**SUBJECT:** Legal Authorization for Emergency Promulgation of Section 2.67:

Small Brewery Tap Room – Application by the Department of Finance and Administration, Alcoholic Beverage Control

Administration

The instant proposed rule establishes the procedure for the submission of an application by an Arkansas small brewery permittee seeking to obtain an endorsement from the Alcoholic Beverage Control to operate a small brewery tap room. Act 950 of 2017, § 4, amended Arkansas Code Annotated § 3-5-1405(a), which concerns the scope of licenses for small breweries, to allow a small brewery to operate no more than two (2) small brewery tap rooms. *See* Ark. Code Ann. § 3-5-1405(a)(8), as amended by Act 950, § 4. Section 3-5-1405 is found within the Arkansas Small Brewery Act ("Act"), Ark. Code Ann. §§ 3-5-1401 through 3-5-1418, as amended by Act 950. The purpose of the Act is to authorize the legal operation of native breweries in order to assure favorable conditions for small businesses, the creation and long-term success of which is vital to the continued economic well-being and prosperity of the State of Arkansas. *See* Ark. Code Ann. § 3-5-1402. Pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 3-5-1413, the Director of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board and the Director of the Department of Finance and Administration may adopt rules for the implementation of the Act.
