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#### PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Agreement is entered into between the State of Arkansas Department of Transformation and Shared Services, Employee Benefits Division ("EBD") and the Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas acting for and on behalf of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, College of Pharmacy's Evidence-Based Prescription Drug Program ("EBRx") (jointly referred to as the "Parties").

WHEREAS, EBD seeks to obtain consulting, technical and operational assistance from EBRx to support management of the EBD's prescription drug program. Such support includes, but is not limited to, clinical recommendations to the Advisory Commissions overseeing the respective plans, oversight of pharmacy program design and implementation, evaluation of program performance, prior authorization/appeals management, pharmacy benefit manager auditing and additional risk management services outlined in the accompanying Statement of Work;

**WHEREAS**, EBRx has agreed to provide such support of EBD activities as detailed in and pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Agreement; and

**THEREFORE**, in consideration of the foregoing, the mutual obligations of the Parties, and other good and valuable considerations, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree to the following:

- 1. EBRx agrees to provide to EBD consulting, operational and technical assistance in management of EBD's prescription drug program as detailed in the attached Statement of Work.
- 2. EBD agrees to pay EBRx \$1.26 Per Member per Month (PMPM) anticipated annual expense of \$2,150,000 based on 142,746 (May 2022 eligible members) for these services as detailed in the attached Statement of Work. Services and expenses to be reimbursed by EBD include, but are not limited to, those detailed in the attached Statement of Work.
- 3. On a monthly basis, EBRx will provide to EBD an invoice for services rendered and expenses incurred during that quarter. The invoices shall be directed to:

4. EBD shall be responsible for timely payment of invoices submitted by EBRx for reimbursement. Payment of such invoices shall be directed to:

- 5. This Agreement shall continue in full force and effect under the terms and conditions provided herein for one (1) year, effective and beginning **July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2023** ("Term"), unless terminated by either Party for any reason by giving written notice to the other Party at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective termination date.
- 6. UAMS shall not be liable for any delay in performance or any failure in performance of services under this Agreement caused in whole or in part by reason of force majeure, which shall be deemed to include the occurrence of any event beyond the control of UAMS, such as war (whether an actual declaration thereof is made or not), sabotage, insurrection, riot and other acts of civil disobedience, action of a public enemy, or acts of any national, state or local government (or any agency, subdivision or instrumentality thereof), judicial action, accident, fire, explosion, flood, storm or other act of God, and national shortage of fuel or raw materials, or interruption of telecommunications services.
- 7. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Arkansas. No amendment or variation of the terms of this agreement shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by a duly authorized representative of UAMS and a duly authorized representative of EBD. A waiver of any of the terms and conditions hereof shall not be construed as a general waiver by the either party to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- 8. Throughout the term of this contract, as requested by EBD or as required by law, the State may add or remove any services offered by the vendor under the scope of this contract. These services may be existing optional services as offered in the vendor's proposal, or they may be newly created services based on improving technology or federal or State mandates which fall under the scope of work. Pricing for these services shall be negotiated if/when the services are added; shall be consistent with current contract pricing for similar services; and shall be agreed upon in writing between agency and vendor prior to implementation of the service.

#### **Statement of Work**

The UAMS College of Pharmacy's Evidence-Based Prescription Drug Program (EBRx) will provide an evidence-based approach in the design and function of EBD's prescription drug program. These services will be provided in the following fashion.

Support of the Arkansas State Board of Finance Advisory Commissions – EBRx will provide guidance to each of the Advisory Commissions established under Act 114 of 2022 regarding drug coverage, drug coverage policies, and benefit design strategies. This guidance will be based on input from the EBRx Pharmacy & Therapeutics Committee. This committee is comprised of Arkansas pharmacists, physicians, and other healthcare providers, as necessary. This committee will meet routinely, review peer-reviewed medical literature related to specific drug therapy and formulate recommendations for consideration of the respective Advisory Commissions.

**On-site pharmacy operations support** – EBRx will provide an on-site pharmacist at EBD to handle day-to-day pharmacy-related issues and serve as an information source to EBD's staff. Additionally, this pharmacist will coordinate Advisory Commission agendas and meeting schedules with the management teams of EBD, EBRx, and committee participants.

**Prior Authorization Call Center** - EBRx will provide a call center staffed with pharmacists to assist physicians requesting prior authorization for specific drugs. Information regarding the plan's drug formulary and/or drug coverage policies will also be provided. All calls will be handled by pharmacists and the call center's hours of operation are 8:00am – 5:00pm Monday through Friday.

**Physician Appeals Management** – EBRx will provide a physician medical director to handle appeals from physicians where an original request for prior authorization was denied. The medical director will review additional information submitted and interface with the prescriber and EBD as necessary.

On-site Pharmacy Benefit Auditing, Programming and Coordination – EBRx will provide oversight and management of the programming of EBD's pharmacy rules into the pharmacy claims adjudication system. This position will work with the management teams of EBD, EBRx and the pharmacy benefit manager in coordinating the programming, implementation and member communication timelines associated with plan design changes.

**Member Services Support** – EBRx will provide customer service personnel to address member calls related to the pharmacy benefit. These personnel will be located in the EBRx call center. This call center will operate from 8:00am – 4:30pm Monday through Friday.

Medical and Pharmacy Claims Analytics – EBRx will perform analytical evaluations of EBD's medical and pharmacy claims for the purpose of identifying cost effectiveness, return-on-investment validation, healthcare improvements, and/or cost savings initiatives. EBRx will work with EBD leadership in providing relevant data/information/recommendations to EBD's appropriate governing commissions for health policy considerations.

Accumulator / Copay Maximizer Program – EBRx will provide authorship and management of EBD's Accumulator / Copay Maximizer Program which is applies manufacturer patient assistance funds directly to the cost of individual prescription drugs, thus reducing the total prescription cost to members and EBD. EBRx will also directly interface with EBD's pharmacy network to ensure optimal performance of the program.

Manufacturer Rebate Management – EBRx will negotiate pharmaceutical manufacturer rebates for EBD. This service is responsible for negotiating rebate agreements with various pharmaceutical companies on behalf of EBD, communicating with EBD, submitting utilization data for billing purposes and tracking rebate collections and other pertinent reporting. It is important to know that all work by this effort will be consistent with EBD's direction and benefit design. These efforts are not intended to maximize rebates at the expense of lower-cost and equally-effective drugs. Rather these efforts are intended to (1) optimize rebate revenue that aligns with the plan's formulary and (2) incorporate some level of long-term price control to temper inflation. All revenues collected will be passed to EBD. This service will be provided through December 31, 2022.

### **Optional Services -**

**Note:** As outlined in Item 2 of the Professional Services Agreement, the services listed below are optional and can be added at EBD's discretion. Adequate preparation and/or lead time may be necessary to satisfactorily implement such services.

**Special Projects** – Projects not identified in the Statement of Work may be necessary from time to time to support the successful management of EBD's program. Such initiatives will be at the discretion of EBD's leadership and will involve collaboration and agreement with EBD leadership. Additional cost associated such initiatives may be addressed through amendment to this agreement.

### RESTRICTION OF BOYCOTT OF ISRAEL CERTIFICATION

Pursuant to Arkansas Code Annotated § 25-1-503, a public entity **shall not** enter into a contract valued at \$1,000 or greater with a company unless the contract includes a written certification that the person or company is not currently engaged in, and agrees for the duration of the contract not to engage in, a boycott of Israel.
