Dear Dr. Markham:

The University of Arkansas System Division of Agriculture requests authorization to provide for a three percent (3%) COLA in fiscal year 2017-18 for its classified employees. With your approval and that of the Arkansas Legislative Council and the Personnel Subcommittee, this COLA will be awarded as a lump-sum payment in December.

The budget for the Division of Agriculture has remained virtually flat for the last decade allowing only for sporadic, minimal increases to the salary base of the employees. It is through cost-saving measures that money is available in FY 17-18 to cover a one-time payment this year for Division employees. This increase was delayed until a comfort level could be reached on the stability of the federal funding of the Division. While a decrease is expected in the federal funding, it is anticipated to be a modest 0.67 percent.

Because the Division is planning on awarding an average merit increase of 3% to nonclassified staff and faculty in December, authorizing the Division to award this lump-sum COLA to its classified staff will enable us to treat the classified staff similar to nonclassified staff. In addition, this will put the classified staff in the same time frame for the award of merit increases as nonclassified staff in this year and in future years.
