

INTRODUCTION

In accordance with the Arkansas Highway Improvement Act of 2016, and specifically Arkansas Code § 27-65-107(a)(19), the Arkansas Highway Commission submits this report on the progress of each public road construction project of ten million dollars (\$10,000,000) or more to the Highway Commission Review and Advisory Subcommittee of the Legislative Council.

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GLOSSARY

ACHM – Asphalt Concrete Hot Mix

Bridge and Approaches - Constructing bridge structures and sections leading up to the bridge

Calendar day contract – Contract where the number of calendar days are bid

CAP – Connecting Arkansas Program

CPM -- Critical Path Method—A step-by-step project management technique that identifies critical activities that must be completed before the next stage can proceed.

(F) - Project with Federal Oversight

Grading and Structures - Earthwork and bridge construction; "structures" includes bridges and drainage structures

Interchange – Improvements to the junction between two or more roadways, typically including an overpass or bridge with associated ramps

IRP – Interstate Rehabilitation Program

Major Widening – Widening of an existing roadway to improve capacity or enhance safety, generally by adding a lane or lanes

New Location – Construction of a roadway on a location not previously developed for vehicular transportation

PCC Pavement – Portland Cement Concrete Pavement

Reconstruction – Generally, removing an existing roadway and building a new road in the same place

Rehabilitation – Modifying or improving an existing roadway; generally less costly and less time consuming than a full reconstruction

Resurfacing – Installation or application of a new driving surface; could be an overlay, sealing job, or similar procedure

ROW – Right of Way

(S) – Project with State Oversight

Safety and Traffic Engineering – Various improvements to enhance safety and/or improve traffic flow

Working Day Contract - Contract for which time will be assessed for each day on which conditions allow the Contractor to work per Standard Specification for Highway Construction 108.06



Increased project cost of \$1.5 million is due to the need for additional quantities of traffic control devices, curb and gutter, drop inlets and pipe culverts, resurfacing/patching of the existing roadway, and the need to remove and replace unsuitable soil at various locations including beneath a retaining wall.

The Contractor is currently working on the north roundabout, paving the eastbound main lanes west of the Saline River and preparing for concrete paving east of the Saline River. Structure work includes the Hwy. 67 westbound bridge and eastbound Saline River Bridge.





The purpose of this project is to construct a Single Point Urban Interchange (SPUI) at the Hwy. 71B Intersection on I-49 in Benton County in the cities of Bentonville and Rogers.



A Single-Point Urban Interchange (SPUI) is designed to help move large volumes of traffic through limited amounts of space safely and efficiently. This project has been delayed due to:

- 1) Legal matters with adjacent business owners concerning right of way acquisition;
- 2) Utility relocation delays;
- 3) Coordinating a design change request from the City of Rogers that occurred after the project was let to contract; and
- 4) Bridge construction issues.

The utility delays on Highway 71B required 313 days to be added to the contract. An additional 87 days were added due to the bridge construction issues, 7 more days were added due to COVID-19 impacts, and 150 days added due to delay of occupancy for ROW tracts and utility relocations.

Additional utilities have been encountered during storm drain installation which will produce further delays to project.

The Contractor continues to be delayed due to multiple ongoing utility relocations. Utility companies are actively working on-site to complete the needed relocations. More utility conflicts have been discovered in the past few months, and such impacts are expected to be resolved next quarter; however, plans are underway to provide the Contractor an ability to work around some of the conflicts in which to progress the job. Weighing the combination of the new conflicts with the potential mitigation strategies, the estimated complete date remains as Mid 2024.

Change orders amounting to approximately \$38k have been processed to add signs, temporary drainage, and adjustments to a pedestrian trail.







This project will allow use of the shoulders on the bridge as part-time travel lanes. The part-time travel lanes will be controlled by the Department's Traffic Management Center through the use of cameras, changeable message boards, and overhead lane control signs. This traffic management strategy has proven to be beneficial where there is recurring congestion due to lack of capacity through a corridor where other alternatives to improve traffic operations, such as widening, are not feasible or are costprohibitive.

Remaining work prior to substantial completion include removal of barrier wall, final striping, testing of ITS and electrical equipment, Entergy providing electrical service and installation of Department furnished network hardware.

The Contractor continues to progress the work in a timely manner and remains on track to complete the project by the estimated completion date.

The project cost has increased approximately \$742,000 in total due to the following: 1) additional repair work required for bridges, i.e. approaches (grade adjustment, repairs), joints and deck (fix deterioration), 2) strengthening edge of lane/shoulders, 3) additional striping for maintenance of traffic, 4) extra erosion control measures, and 5) additional quantities of temporary barrier wall needed to safely construct the project according to plan.

While the Contractor has already completed work on seven bridges, the two bridges spanning the Arkansas River in Fort Smith represent a significant portion of the work allotted in the Contract. Once these two bridges are completed, an increase in the Contractor's productivity will be shown.



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
