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## GLOSSARY

ACHM – Asphalt Concrete Hot Mix

Bridge and Approaches - Constructing bridge structures and sections leading up to the bridge

Calendar day contract – Contract where the number of calendar days are bid

**CAP** – Connecting Arkansas Program

**CPM** -- Critical Path Method—A step-by-step project management technique that identifies critical activities that must be completed before the next stage can proceed.

(F) - Project with Federal Oversight

**Grading and Structures** – Earthwork and bridge construction; "structures" includes bridges and drainage structures

**Interchange** – Improvements to the junction between two or more roadways, typically including an overpass or bridge with associated ramps

IRP – Interstate Rehabilitation Program

**Major Widening** – Widening of an existing roadway to improve capacity or enhance safety, generally by adding a lane or lanes

**New Location** – Construction of a roadway on a location not previously developed for vehicular transportation

PCC Pavement – Portland Cement Concrete Pavement

Reconstruction – Generally, removing an existing roadway and building a new road in the same place

**Rehabilitation** – Modifying or improving an existing roadway; generally less costly and less time consuming than a full reconstruction

**Resurfacing** – Installation or application of a new driving surface; could be an overlay, sealing job, or similar procedure

**ROW** – Right of Way

(S) – Project with State Oversight

Safety and Traffic Engineering - Various improvements to enhance safety and/or improve traffic flow

**Working Day Contract** – Contract for which time will be assessed for each day on which conditions allow the Contractor to work per Standard Specification for Highway Construction 108.06



The purpose of this project is to widen 5.9 miles of I-30 from four lanes to six lanes west of Benton in Saline County.



Increased project cost of \$1.7 million is due to the need for additional quantities of traffic control devices, curb and gutter, drop inlets and pipe culverts, resurfacing/patching of the existing roadway, and the need to remove and replace unsuitable soil at various locations including beneath a retaining wall.

A traffic switch was performed on September 23 which placed the westbound traffic onto the new Hwy. 67 overpass, which allowed the removal of the temporary bridge over Hwy. 67. The Contractor is currently placing concrete pavement on the eastbound lanes east and west of the Saline River and working on the roundabout/South Street area. Structural work includes the eastbound Saline River bridge, eastbound Saline River Relief bridge and eastbound Hwy. 67 bridge.





This project is also referred to as the 30 Crossing Project. It is the Department's first Design-Build Project.

The project's overall cost has increased by approximately \$93 million due to the following: \$37.3 million to add the demolition, design, and reconstruction of the 9th Street overpass of I-30, including associated retaining wall work along I-30; \$55.4 million to add an entrance ramp linking the southbound frontage road to I-630 westbound.

I-30 traffic was placed on the new eastbound Arkansas River Bridge in September 2022. Demolition of the existing I-30 Arkansas River Bridge began September 19, 2022 and is scheduled to be complete July 2023. Construction of the westbound I-30 Arkansas River Bridge will begin November 2022.



The Contractor and the Department have partnered to expand the allowable main lane closure time limits by one (1 hour. This change has resulted in a reduction in Contract time of five (5 calendar days and is expected to increase production of main lane paving.

The current Contract amount has increased by approximately \$145,000 due to additional special clearing 30' from the edge of both outside shoulders.



The purpose of this project is to construct a Single Point Urban Interchange (SPUI) at the Hwy. 71B Intersection on I-49 in Benton County in the cities of Bentonville and Rogers.



A Single-Point Urban Interchange (SPUI) is designed to help move large volumes of traffic through limited amounts of space safely and efficiently. This project has been delayed due to:

1) Legal matters with adjacent business owners concerning right of way acquisition;

2) Utility relocation delays;

3) Coordinating a design change request from the City of Rogers that occurred after the project was let to contract;

and

4) Bridge construction issues.

The utility delays on Highway 71B required 313 days to be added to the contract. An additional 87 days were added due to the bridge construction issues, 7 more days were added due to COVID-19 impacts, and 150 days added due to delay of occupancy for ROW tracts and utility relocations.

Additional utilities have been encountered during storm drain installation which will produce further delays to the project. These utilities have been relocated and the Contractor is preparing their documentation for the delays incurred. It is expected that 266 days will be added to the Contract time.

Utility relocations have been completed with the Contractor restarting work in September 2022. According to the latest project schedule, the utility delays have pushed completion of the project into Late 2024.

Change orders amounting to approximately \$475k have been processed to add signs, temporary drainage, adjustments to a pedestrian trail, shoulder strengthening for maintenance of traffic (\$346k), subgrade stability, revision of drainage to avoid utilities (\$78k), and additional removal and disposal of various items.



To date this contract has been extended by 20 days due to additional work added by change order. Existing pipe crossings were in poor condition and could not be extended as originally planned. The Contract cost has increased by \$371,000 due to replacement of drainage structures, replacement of unsuitable soils, additional paving needed for grade corrections, additional patching of existing roadway, concrete island, and asphalt for driveways.

The Contractor's progression of the work earlier this year indicated the potential for a sooner than anticipated (in terms of Contract Time) completion of the project; however, given the Contractor's most recent progress, it is now anticipated that if the Contractor is able to start the Arkansas River bridges this year, they should complete the project later yet still within the allotted Contract Time.

The project cost has increased approximately \$640,000 in total due to the following: 1) additional repair work required for bridges, i.e. approaches (grade adjustment, repairs), joints and deck (fix deterioration), and areas leading into bridges, i.e. median modifications, 2) strengthening edge of lane/shoulders, 3) additional striping for maintenance of traffic, 4) extra erosion control measures, 5) additional quantities of temporary barrier wall needed to safely construct the project according to plan, and 6) cost savings have been produced through changes in maintenance of traffic.

The Contractor has already completed work on 12 of 19 bridges, yet the two bridges spanning the Arkansas River in Fort Smith represent a significant portion of the work allotted in the Contract. It is believed once these two bridges are completed, a large increase in the Contractor's productivity will be reflected.





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

(f) During each fiscal year, after the provisions of § 19-5-1004(b)(2) 3 4 are complied with, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State may replenish the Arkansas Rainy Day Fund Long Term Reserve Fund by transferring no more than 5 6 fifty percent (50%) of the balance in the General Revenue Allotment Reserve 7 Fund or an amount equal to all transfers made under this section during the 8 fiscal year immediately preceding the fiscal year in which such replenishment 9 is made under this section, whichever is less, to the Arkansas Rainy Day Fund 10 Long Term Reserve Fund. In no event shall the balance of the Arkansas Rainy 11 Day Fund Long Term Reserve Fund exceed one hundred twenty five million 12 dollars (\$125,000,000) at any time.

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SECTION 16. Arkansas Code § 26-56-201(f), concerning the imposition and distribution of distillate special fuels tax, is amended to read as follows:

(f) Except as provided in subsection (g) of this section, the The additional taxes collected under this section are special revenues and shall be distributed as set forth in the Arkansas Highway Revenue Distribution Law, \$ 27-70-201 et seq., subject to any requirements for the repayment of bonds issued under the Arkansas Highway Financing Act of 1999, \$ 27-64-201 et seq., the Arkansas Interstate Highway Financing Act of 2007, \$ 27-64-401 et seq., and the Arkansas Highway Financing Act of 2011, \$ 27-64-501 et seq.

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25 SECTION 17. Arkansas Code § 26-56-201(g), concerning the imposition 26 and distribution of distillate special fuels tax, is amended to read as 27 follows:

20	(c) It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed

23	Executive Recommendations, and Legislative Recommendations contained in the
24	budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration,

29	SECTION 22. EFFECTIVE DATE. Sections 9-12, 14, 16 and 17 of this act
30	are effective on and after July 1, 2017.

32	SECTION 23. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
33	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that Arkansas bridges and roads are
34	in need of repair and proper maintenance; that the repair and proper
35	maintenance of Arkansas bridges and roads are necessary for the preservation
36	of the public peace, health, and safety; that increased funding is essential

1	to the repair and proper maintenance of Arkansas bridges and roads; that this
2	act is designed to provide the necessary funding that is essential to the
3	repair and proper maintenance of Arkansas bridges and roads, and this act is
4	necessary because without this increased funding, the repair and proper
5	maintenance of Arkansas bridges and roads may not be performed. Therefore, an
6	emergency is declared to exist, and Sections 1-8, 13, 15, 18-21 of this act
7	being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health,
8	and safety shall become effective on July 1, 2016.
