

INTRODUCTION

In accordance with the Arkansas Highway Improvement Act of 2016, and specifically Arkansas Code § 27-65-107(a)(19), the Arkansas Highway Commission submits this report on the progress of each public road construction project of ten million dollars (\$10,000,000) or more to the Highway Commission Review and Advisory Subcommittee of the Legislative Council.

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GLOSSARY

ACHM – Asphalt Concrete Hot Mix

Bridge and Approaches - Constructing bridge structures and sections leading up to the bridge

Calendar day contract – Contract where the number of calendar days are bid

CAP – Connecting Arkansas Program

(F) – Project with Federal Oversight

Grading and Structures - Earthwork and bridge construction; "structures" includes bridges and drainage structures

Interchange – Improvements to the junction between two or more roadways, typically including an overpass or bridge with associated ramps

IRP – Interstate Rehabilitation Program

Major Widening – Widening of an existing roadway to improve capacity or enhance safety, generally by adding a lane or lanes

New Location – Construction of a roadway on a location not previously developed for vehicular transportation

PCC Pavement – Portland Cement Concrete Pavement

Reconstruction – Generally, removing an existing roadway and building a new road in the same place

Rehabilitation – Modifying or improving an existing roadway; generally less costly and less time consuming than a full reconstruction

Resurfacing – Installation or application of a new driving surface; could be an overlay, sealing job, or similar procedure

(S) – Project with State Oversight

Safety and Traffic Engineering – Various improvements to enhance safety and/or improve traffic flow

Working Day Contract - Contract for which time will be assessed for each day on which conditions allow the Contractor to work per Standard Specification for Highway Construction 108.06

Description of Project:

The purpose of this project is to resurface 19.3 miles of I-30 in Clark, Hempstead and Nevada Counties.

This project was declared substantially complete on 1/8/2020. Striping, Removable Pavement Markings, and a few other items remain to be completed, but will be accomplished when warmer weather is present.

As part of the I-30 Interstate Rehabilitation project from Hwy 299 (Emmett) to the Gurdon Rest Area, ARDOT is clearing a portion of the trees and vegetation along the sides and median of the interstate. Over the past 50+ years, trees outside the mowed area have grown to a substantial size. These trees negatively impact our roadways when they grow too close, due to the roots migrating under the roadway subgrade. The expansive clay soils in this area are more susceptible to cracking and movement when tree roots are present. This clearing provides other safety and environmental benefits such as: a wider clear zone for vehicles that lose control and depart the roadway; reduced chances of trees falling across the roadway; improved clearing of snow or ice from the pavement after weather events, and wildflower habitat for enhanced beauty and pollinators.

Current Contract Amount: Two bridges on the project were changed from a planned polymer overlay to a Latex Modified Overlay with Hydrodemolition by change order. The bridges in question were in too poor of a condition for the polymer overlay and the decision was made to perform the latex modified overlay under this contract. This resulted in an overrun of \$2.4 million. Automated Work Zone Information System added to the project by change order for \$500,000.

The purpose of this project is to widen 2.2 miles of I-630 from six lanes to eight lanes in Little Rock, Pulaski County.

This job suffered delays to the schedule due to weather events, and the reconstruction of drainage grates in the median/inside lane. The increased contract amount is due to additional work for subgrade failures, water runoff issues, replacing existing pavement discovered to be in poor structural condition and the addition of a wall to protect an earthen berm utilized as a noise barrier for an adjacent neighborhood amounting to approximately \$2.5 million. An additional \$2.5 million is due to a number of lower cost changes throughout the project. Work is underway to complete the final stage of two bridges, reconstruction of the median barrier wall, isolated areas of concrete pavement and overall general cleanup.





Scheduled STIP Projects Estimated at \$10 Million or More As Of December 31, 2019



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29	SECTION 22. EFFECTIVE DATE. Sections 9-12, 14, 16 and 17 of this act
30	are effective on and after July 1, 2017.
31	
32	SECTION 23. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
33	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that Arkansas bridges and roads are
34	in need of repair and proper maintenance; that the repair and proper
35	maintenance of Arkansas bridges and roads are necessary for the preservation
36	of the nublic peace, health, and safety: that increased funding is essential

1	to the repair and proper maintenance of Arkansas bridges and roads; that this
2	act is designed to provide the necessary funding that is essential to the
3	repair and proper maintenance of Arkansas bridges and roads, and this act is
4	necessary because without this increased funding, the repair and proper
5	maintenance of Arkansas bridges and roads may not be performed. Therefore, an
6	emergency is declared to exist, and Sections 1-8, 13, 15, 18-21 of this act
7	being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health,
8	and safety shall become effective on July 1, 2016.
