1 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 27-35-203(d)(1), concerning load limits, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 (d)(1) Except as provided in subsection (j) of this section, Subject 4 subject to the limit upon the weight imposed upon the highway through any one 5 (1) axle as set forth in subsections (a)-(c) of this section, no vehicle, or 6 combination of vehicles, shall be operated upon the highways of this state 7 when the gross weight is in excess of eighty thousand pounds (80,000 lbs.). 8 9 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 27-35-203, concerning load limits, is 10 amended to add an additional subsection to read as follows: 11 (j)(1) A maximum gross weight of ninety thousand pounds (90,000 lbs) is permitted for a five-axle vehicle with: 12 13 (A) A minimum fifty-one-foot outer bridge measurement; (B) Has a maximum tandem limit of forty thousand pounds 14 15 (40,000 lbs.); and 16 (C) Is transporting precursor raw materials for paper 17 products, unfinished and unprocessed forest products, or logs. (2) However, a five-axle vehicle under subdivision (j)(l) of 18 this section shall not: 19 20 (A) Travel on any weight-restricted highway; or (B) Cross any bridge with a posted weight limit below the 21 22 gross weight of the vehicle. 23 SECTION 3. DO NOT CODIFY. Retroactivity. 24 25 This act applies retroactively to January 1, 2021. 26 SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 27 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) 28 continues to spread within the State of Arkansas and adjoining states, 29 30 threatening the public safety of the citizens of Arkansas, and it is expected that the spread will continue; that Executive Order 20-37 was in effect until 31 32 December 31, 2020, exempting commercial motor vehicles transporting precursor raw materials for paper products, unfinished and unprocessed forest products, 33 or logs; that there continues to be a shortage of paper products in the 34 state; and that this act is immediately necessary because it is essential to 35 supply grocery stores, homes, and restaurants with these commodities. 36

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1	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately
2	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall
3	become effective on:
4	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
5	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
6	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
7	bill; or
8	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
9	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
