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GLOSSARY

ACHM – Asphalt Concrete Hot Mix

Bridge and Approaches - Constructing bridge structures and sections leading up to the bridge

Calendar day contract – Contract where the number of calendar days are bid

CAP – Connecting Arkansas Program

CPM -- Critical Path Method—A step-by-step project management technique that identifies critical activities that must be completed before the next stage can proceed.

(F) - Project with Federal Oversight

Grading and Structures – Earthwork and bridge construction; "structures" includes bridges and drainage structures

Interchange – Improvements to the junction between two or more roadways, typically including an overpass or bridge with associated ramps

IRP – Interstate Rehabilitation Program

Major Widening – Widening of an existing roadway to improve capacity or enhance safety, generally by adding a lane or lanes

New Location – Construction of a roadway on a location not previously developed for vehicular transportation

PCC Pavement – Portland Cement Concrete Pavement

Reconstruction – Generally, removing an existing roadway and building a new road in the same place

Rehabilitation – Modifying or improving an existing roadway; generally less costly and less time consuming than a full reconstruction

Resurfacing – Installation or application of a new driving surface; could be an overlay, sealing job, or similar procedure

ROW – Right of Way

(S) – Project with State Oversight

Safety and Traffic Engineering - Various improvements to enhance safety and/or improve traffic flow

Working Day Contract – Contract for which time will be assessed for each day on which conditions allow the Contractor to work per Standard Specification for Highway Construction 108.06




Westbound traffic has been routed to the temporary bridge and work on westbound main lane bridges and concrete paving is currently the focus.





The last three months of work have been: cold milling of existing pavement, placement of new asphalt pavement, installing rumble strips and thermoplastic pavement markings, patching of concrete on ramps, mulching of cut trees, hydrodemolition and latex modified concrete operations.



The purpose of this project is to replace the White River Bridge on I-40 in Prairie County.



This project has been delayed due to high river levels which has, at times, overtopped the access roads.

On August 22, 2019, the Contractor began pouring concrete for the Bent Cap of Pier 1. During the pour, a weather event occurred and the Contractor elected to halt work. After an approximate 3-hour delay, the Contractor elected to continue pouring concrete for the Bent Cap of Pier 1. Due to the 3-hour delay, an unacceptable product was created since a cold joint now existed in the cap, which is detrimental to the life span of the structure. Discussions between the Department and the Contractor resulted in an approved remediation plan for the Bent Cap of Pier 1. This work has been completed.

Bridge construction is complete and traffic is now on the new bridge. The contractor is in the process of completing the asphalt for the bridge approaches that will allow traffic to be routed into the final traffic patterns. The existing bridge structure has been removed.

1) Legal matters with adjacent business owners concerning right of way acquisition;

2) Utility relocation delays;

3) Coordinating a design change request from the City of Rogers that occurred after the project was let to contract; and

4) Bridge construction issues.

The utility delays on Highway 71B required 313 days to be added to the contract. An additional 87 days were added due to the bridge construction issues, 7 more days were added due to COVID-19 impacts, and 102 days were recently added due to delay of occupancy for ROW tracts.





25	SECTION 19. Arkansas Code § 27-65-107(a), concerning the powers and
26	duties of the State Highway Commission, is amended to add additional
27	subdivisions to read as follows:
28	(18)(A) To propose and submit rules regarding the:
29	(i) Criteria for distribution of funds and the
30	distribution of funds from the:
31	(a) State Highway and Transportation
32	Department Fund; and
33	(b) Road and Bridge Repair, Maintenance, and
34	Grants Fund; and
35	(ii) Spending priority designated for highway
36	construction contracts and public road construction projects by the Arkansas
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1	State Highway and Transportation Department and the commission, including the
2	criteria used to establish the spending priority.
3	(B)(i) The commission shall submit the proposed rules
4	required under subdivision (a)(18)(A) of this section to the Highway
5	Commission Review and Advisory Subcommittee of the Legislative Council for
6	review.
7	(ii) Proposed rules required under subdivision
8	(a)(18)(A) of this section that are under consideration at the time the act
9	passes do not require review by the Highway Commission Review and Advisory
10	Subcommittee of the Legislative Council prior to implementation but shall be
11	submitted to the Highway Commission Review and Advisory Subcommittee of the
12	Legislative Council by October 1, 2017 as a report.
13	(iii) The proposed rules required under subdivision
14	(a)(18)(A) of this section are not required to be promulgated under the
15	Arkansas Administrative Procedure Act, § 25-15-201 et seq., but shall be
16	published after review by the Highway Commission Review and Advisory
17	Subcommittee of the Legislative Council; and
18	(19) To provide the Highway Commission Review and Advisory
19	Subcommittee of the Legislative Council with a report on the progress of each
20	public road construction project of ten million dollars (\$10,000,000) or more
21	at least quarterly or as required by the Highway Commission Review and
22	Advisory Subcommittee of the Legislative Council.
23	
24	SECTION 20. Arkansas Code § 27-65-107, concerning the powers and
25	duties of the State Highway Commission, is amended to add an additional
26	subsection to read as follows:
27	(d) As used in this section:
28	(1) "Highway construction contract" means a contract for the
29	construction, restoration, reconstruction, renovation, or repair of a road,
30	highway, bridge, overpass, interchange, right-of-way, or turnpike that is
31	part of the state highway system; and
32	(2) "Public road construction project" means the construction,
33	restoration, reconstruction, renovation, or repair of a road, highway,
34	street, bridge, overpass, interchange, or right-of-way in which the
35	construction, restoration, reconstruction, renovation, or repair is to be
36	performed or is initiated by the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation

1	Department or the commission.
2	
3	SECTION 21. TEMPORARY LANGUAGE. DO NOT CODIFY.
4	(a) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall make a one-time
5	transfer on his or her books and those of the Treasurer of State and the
6	Auditor of State the sum of forty million dollars (\$40,000,000) from the
7	funds available in the Rainy Day Set-Aside of the 90 $^{ m th}$ Session Projects
8	Account of the General Improvement Fund as authorized by Acts 2015, No. 1147,
9	§ 3(a)(11), to the Arkansas Highway Transfer Fund there to be used only for
10	the purposes set forth in § 19-6-832.
11	(b) Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to
12	the appropriation for the agency and funds made available by law for the
13	support of the appropriations. The restrictions of the Arkansas Procurement
14	Law, § 19-11-201 et seq., the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures
15	Law, § 19-4-101 et seq., the Revenue Stabilization Law, § 19-5-101 et seq.,
16	the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, § 21-5-101 et seq., and
17	other fiscal control laws of this state, where applicable, and regulations
18	promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by
19	law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of the funds.
20	(c) It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed
21	under the authority of this act shall be in compliance with the stated
22	reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests,
23	Executive Recommendations, and Legislative Recommendations contained in the
24	budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration,
25	letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the
26	Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and
27	adoption.
28	
29	SECTION 22. EFFECTIVE DATE. Sections 9-12, 14, 16 and 17 of this act
30	are effective on and after July 1, 2017.
31	
32	SECTION 23. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
33	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that Arkansas bridges and roads are
34	in need of repair and proper maintenance; that the repair and proper
35	maintenance of Arkansas bridges and roads are necessary for the preservation
36	of the public peace, health, and safety; that increased funding is essential

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1	to the repair and proper maintenance of Arkansas bridges and roads; that this
2	act is designed to provide the necessary funding that is essential to the
3	repair and proper maintenance of Arkansas bridges and roads, and this act is
4	necessary because without this increased funding, the repair and proper
5	maintenance of Arkansas bridges and roads may not be performed. Therefore, an
6	emergency is declared to exist, and Sections 1-8, 13, 15, 18-21 of this act
7	being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health,
8	and safety shall become effective on July 1, 2016.
