January/February--Problem/Solution Paper

-Conduct research on your problem and highlight some potential solutions

March--Action and Reflection

-Do something about your topic that makes a difference

-Reflect on your action through writing

April/May--Final Presentation

-The entire project combined into a thoughtful, creative final presentation
