"[A] public elementary/secondary school that addresses needs of students that typically cannot be met in regular school ..."

Arkansas's Definition of ALE

Act 59 of 2003

"to eliminate traditional barriers to learning for students"

ALE Students ALE FTE Students (K-12)



% of All Students → Students

Must meet 2 of 12 characteristics:

- Ongoing, persistent lack of attaining proficiency in literacy and math
- Abuse physical, mental or sexual
- Frequent relocation of residency
- Homelessness
- Inadequate emotional support

- Mental/physical health problems
- Pregnancy
- Single parenting
- Personal or family problems
- Recurring absenteeism
- Dropping out of school
- Disruptive behavior






2015-16 ALE Student Counts by Grade -- Arkansas



2015-16 ALE Student Counts by Grade – Pulaski County Districts




ALE Students Race (2015-16)


ALE Students Gender (2015-16)














Arch Ford MOUs

- Not all measures called for in law/rule reported; i.e., ALE dropout rate, ALE improved attendance, ALE credit recovery improvement
