

INTERIM STUDY PROPOSAL 2025-007

REQUESTING THAT THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL REFER A STUDY TO THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION ON THE FUTURE OF ADULT EDUCATION IN ARKANSAS.

WHEREAS, in 2023, the Adult Education Section of the Division of Workforce Services reported that approximately three hundred thousand (300,000) Arkansans lacked a high school diploma; and

WHEREAS, without a high school diploma or the successful completion of the General Education Development (GED) test, adults often face difficulties obtaining meaningful employment; and

WHEREAS, a thorough study of the current state of adult education in Arkansas is necessary to understand the issues surrounding adult education to better serve Arkansans,

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT PROPOSED BY THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

THAT the Arkansas Legislative Council refer to the House Committee on Education a study concerning the future of adult education in Arkansas, including without limitation a study of:

- (1) General Education Development (GED) tests;
- (2) High school diplomas;
- (3) In-person adult education charter schools; and
- (4) The allocation of funding for adult education.

BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED THAT when conducting the study, the House Committee on Education invite stakeholders to provide input, including without limitation the Office of Skills Development, the Division of Career and Technical Education, and the University of Arkansas Office for Education Policy.
